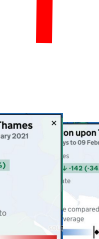

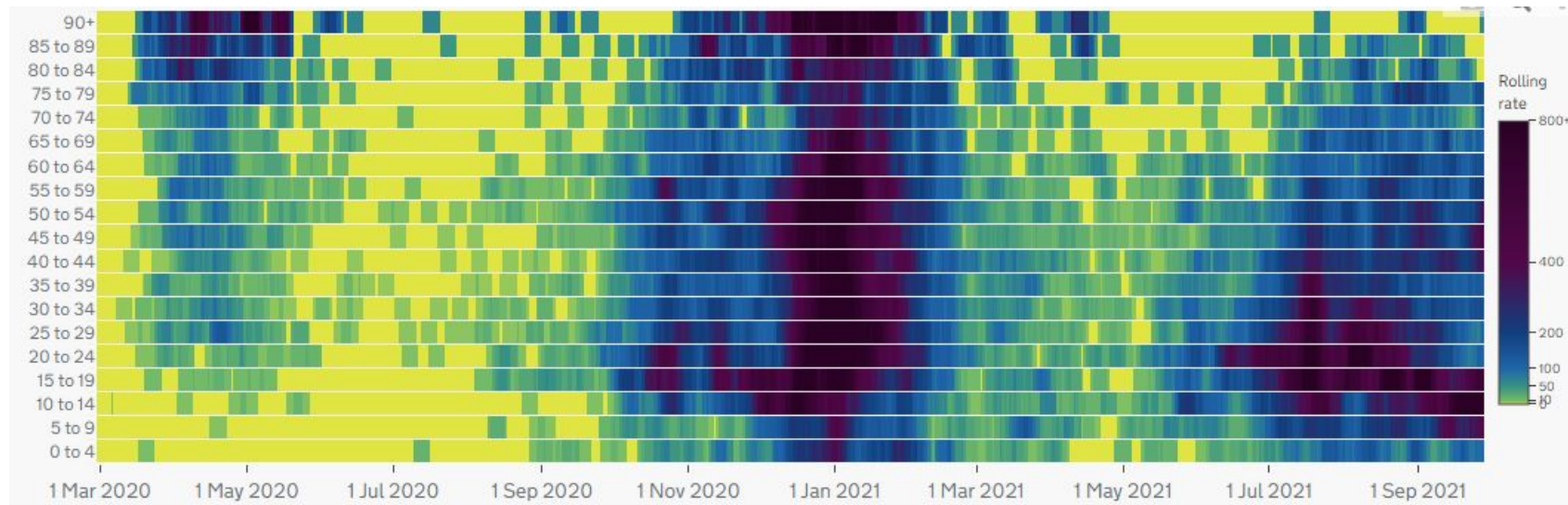
Average daily case numbers have started to increase

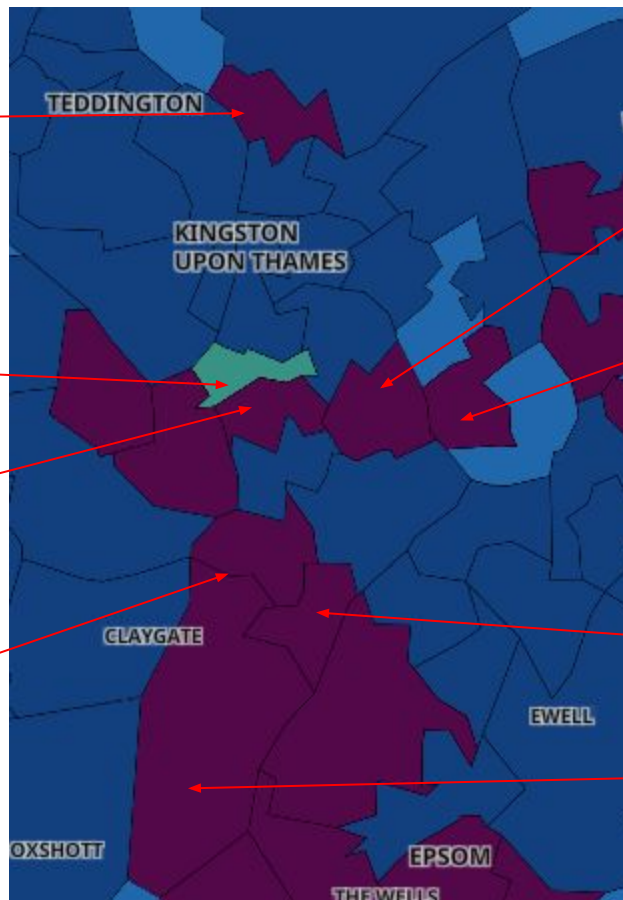

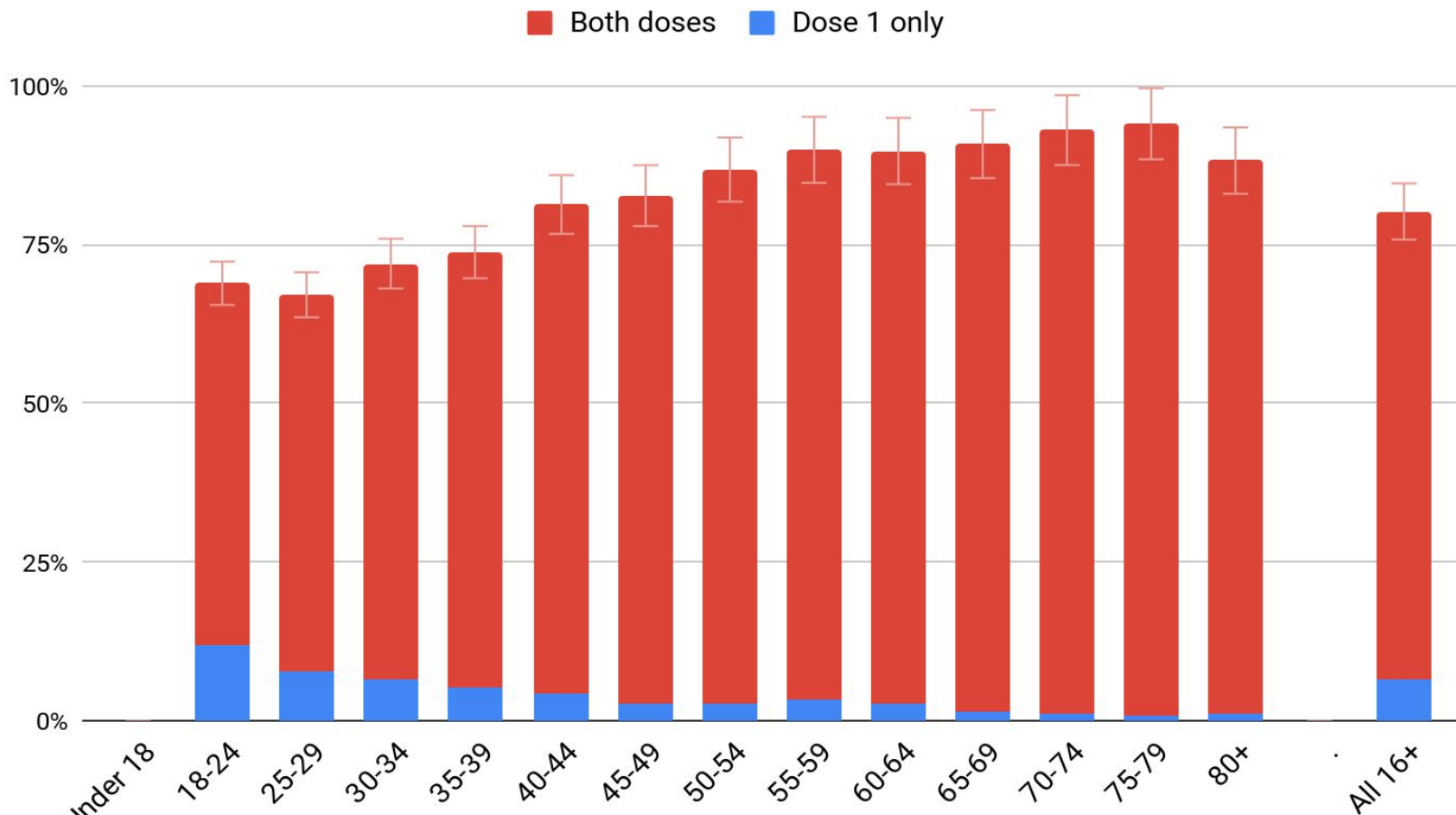
Just over 300 residents had their first dose this week, which is the most for a month but still low by historical standards

Four out of five (range 75-86%) of Kingston's adult population have had at least one vaccination,

Weekly second dose numbers are holding steady at around 800 per week, mostly 18 - 29 year olds.

74% (range 69-79%) of adult residents are now fully protected.

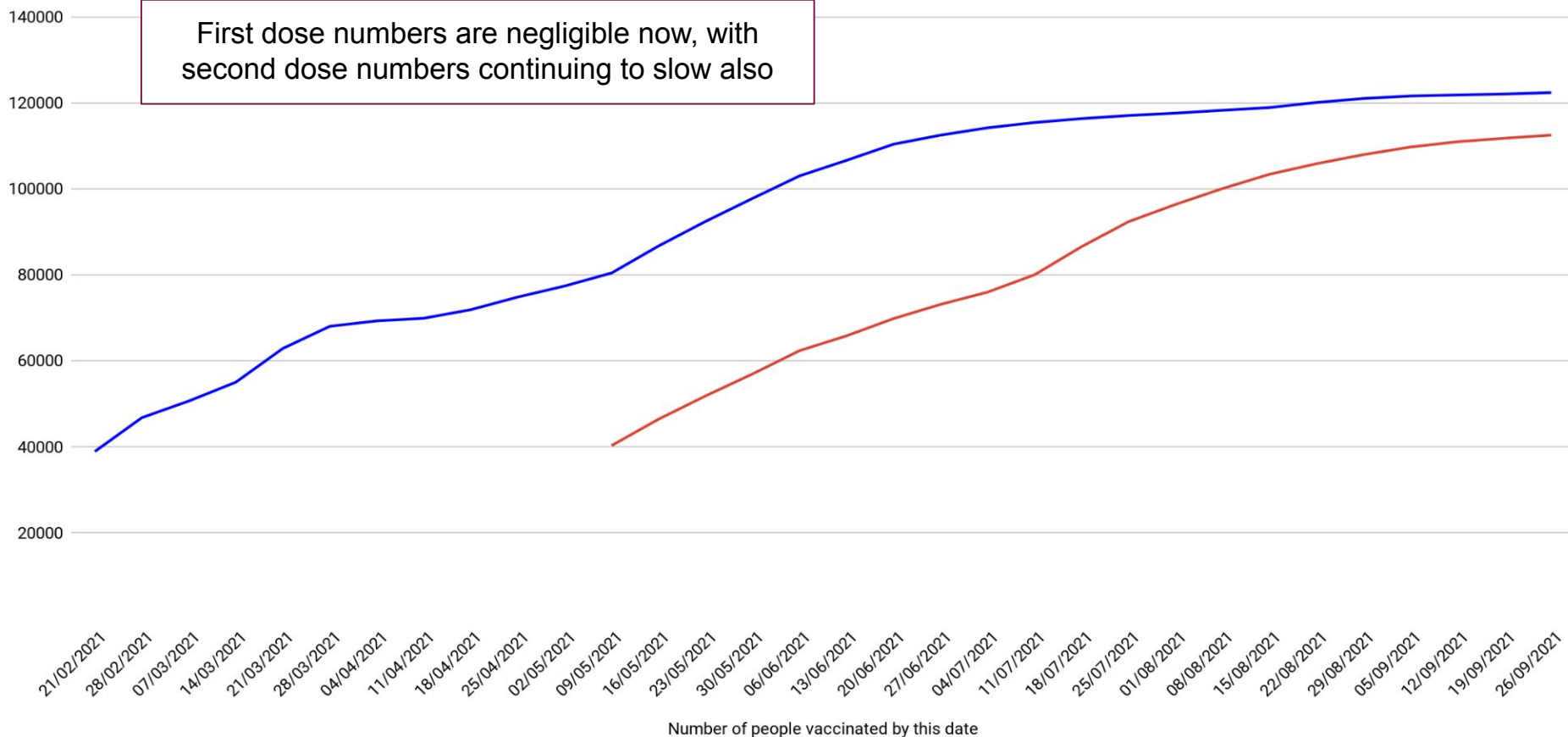

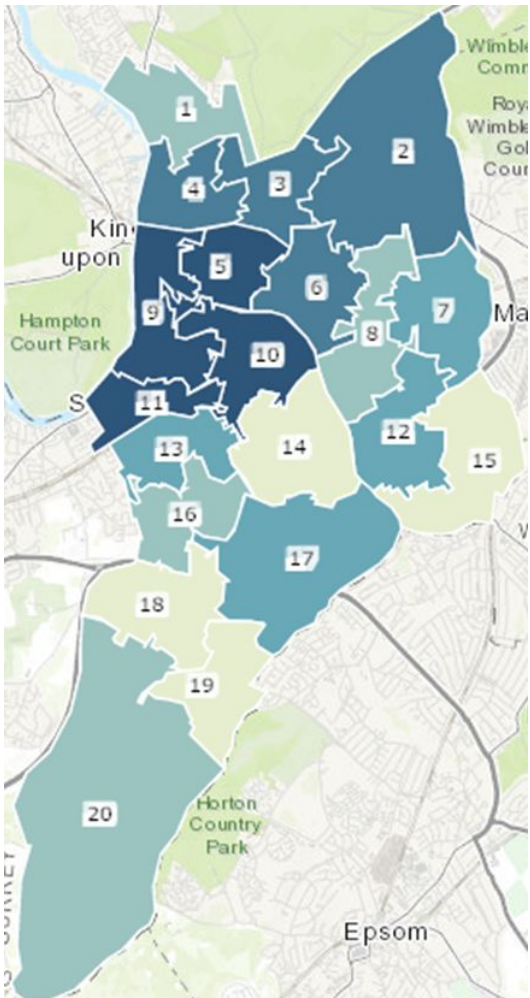

First dose numbers are negligible now, with second dose numbers continuing to slow also

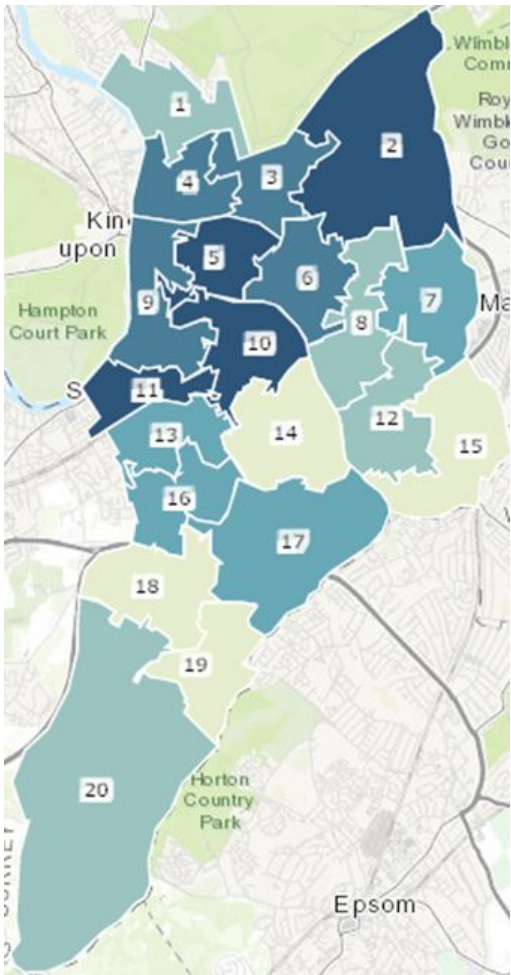


MSOA map of vaccination % uptake to September 26th 2021 **all ages**

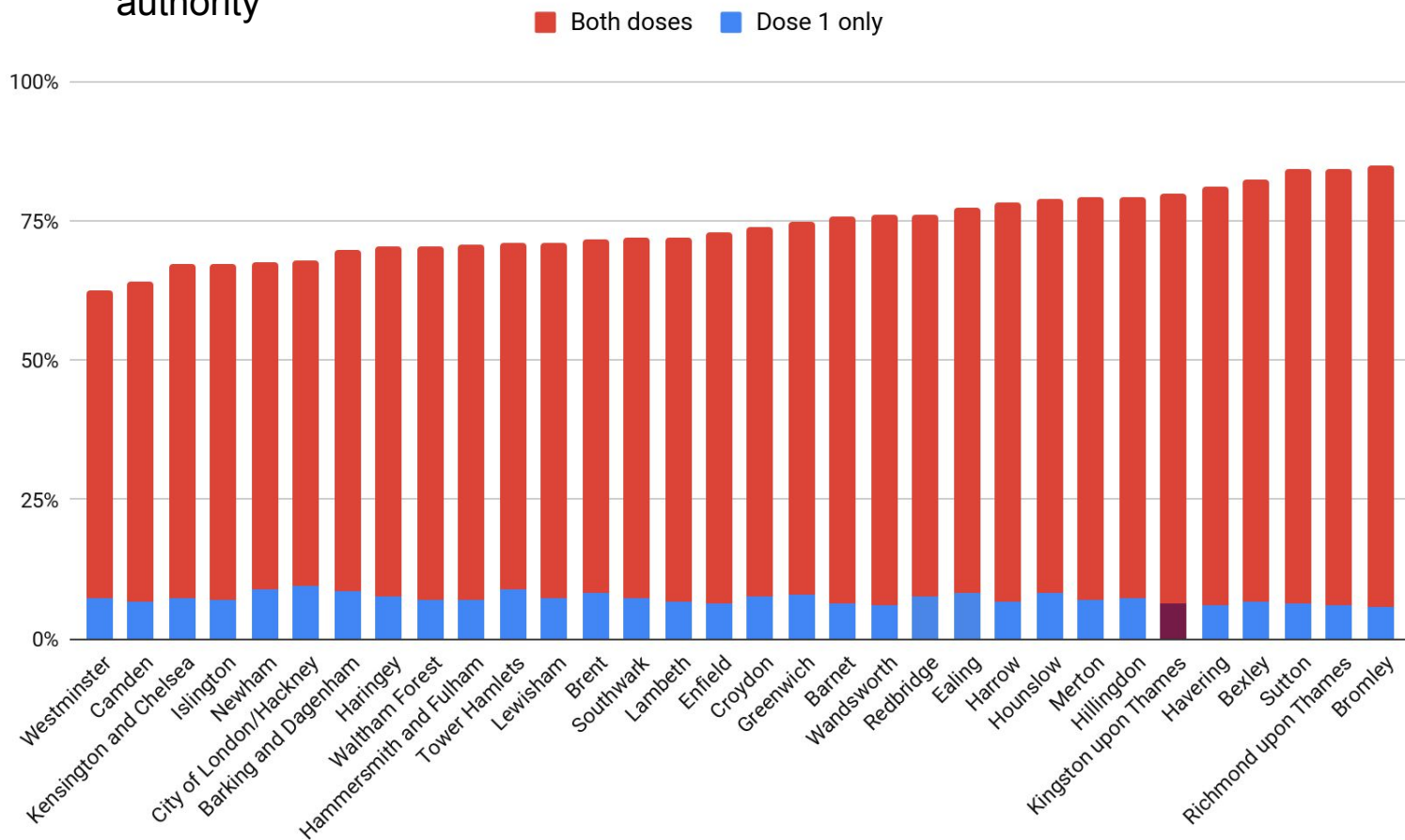


MSOAs have been split into five groups, with darker colours reflecting a lower first dose uptake

For younger residents, the lowest uptake is around Coombe and Norbiton, as opposed to Kingston Town for all adults

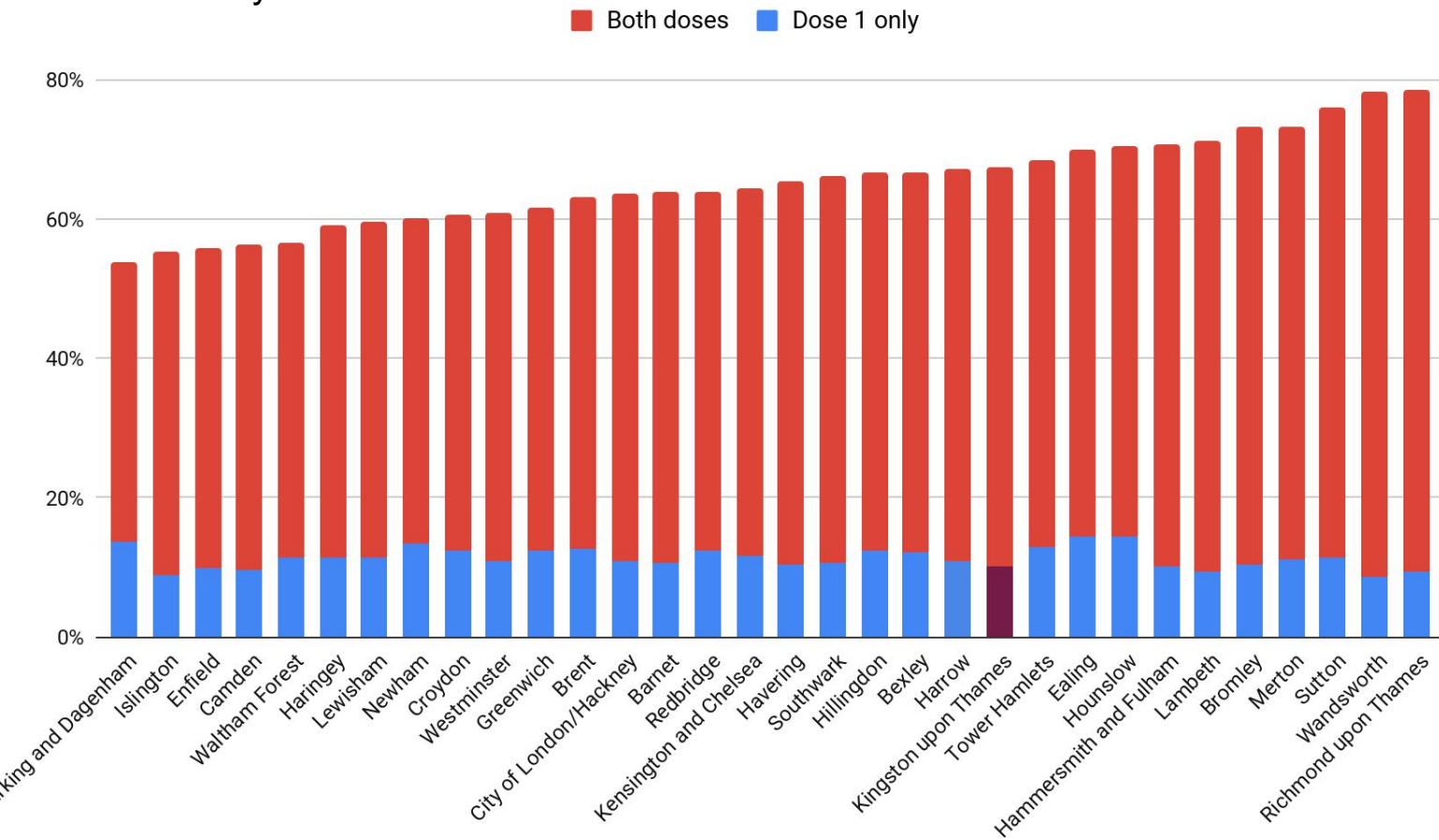

Percentage of London residents vaccinated to September 26th 2021, all ages, by local authority



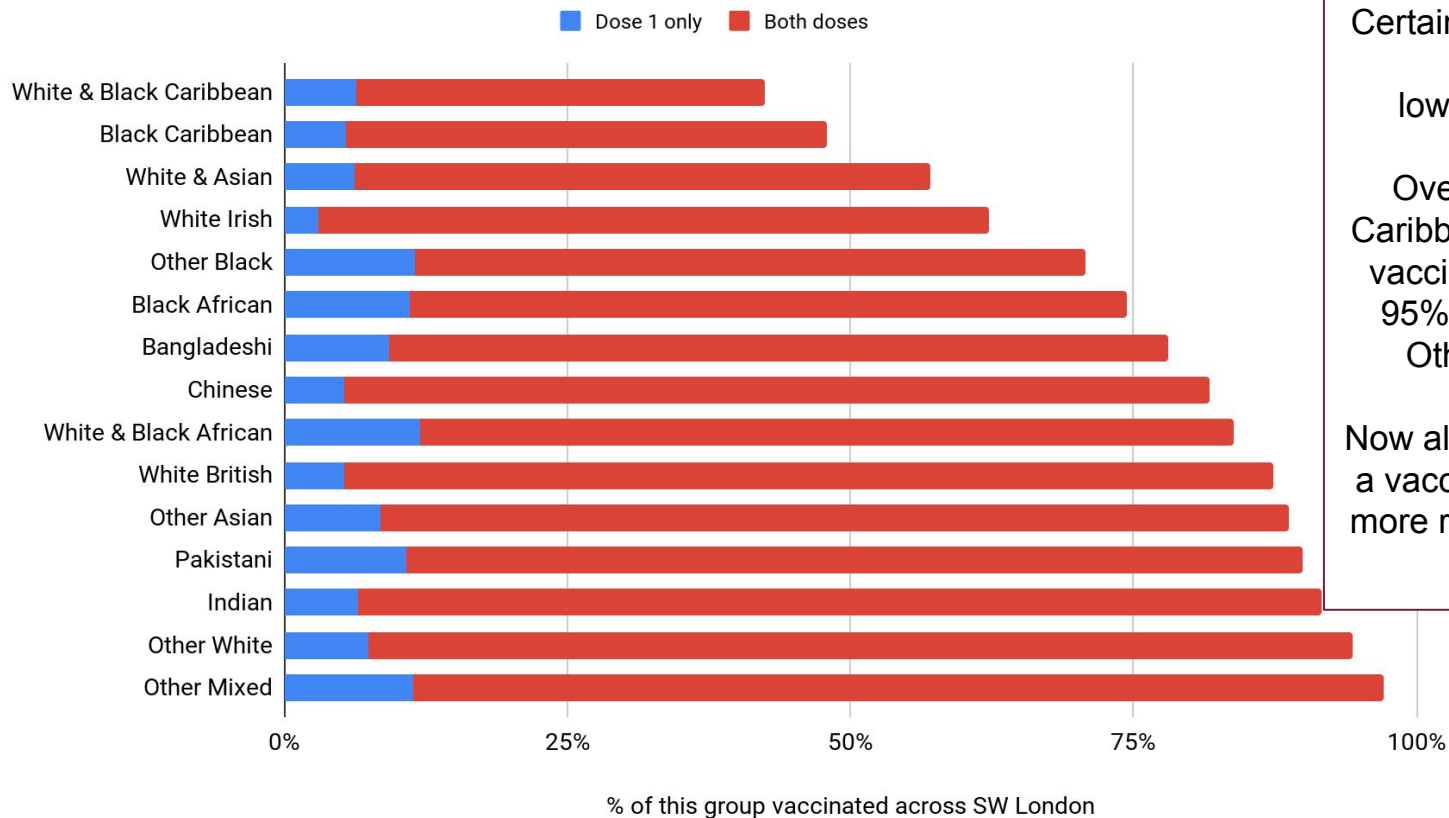
Kingston's uptake is one of the highest in London, and similar to our SWL neighbours, however demographic and ethnic profiles vary between boroughs, accounting for some of the variation seen

Percentage of London residents vaccinated to September 26th 2021, 18-29 year olds only



Even though Kingston's uptake is lower than the SWL average, it is still relatively high when compared to all London local authorities

Proportion of ethnic groups vaccinated in South West London, to September 26th 2021



Certain Mixed and Black groups are amongst the lowest-vaccinated overall.

Over 40% of White & Black Caribbean residents have had a vaccine dose, rising to almost 95% of the Other Mixed and Other White populations.

Now all adults have been offered a vaccination, this chart gives a more rounded picture of take-up across ethnicities

N.B. the 'other ethnic group' has been removed as it is reporting well over 100% completion due to an underestimate of the size of this group

Communications messages: we need to keep reinforcing the 'be cautious' and 'get tested' and promote the vaccination opportunity messages

- Meet up outside, or keep windows and doors open to circulate **fresh air** inside
- Take **rapid lateral flow tests** twice a week

- Wear **face coverings** on public transport, and in busy indoor spaces
- Download the **NHS COVID-19 app**
- **Wash your hands** regularly with warm soapy water

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Key vaccination messages



- All children over 12 year olds will be offered one dose of the Pfizer vaccine, and programme is underway
 - All 16-17 year olds are eligible for one Pfizer dose and uptake has been very positive - around 3 in every 4 are now vaccinated
 - Walk-in clinics in the borough available for all eligible 16 years+ - it's never been easier
 - 12-15 year old vulnerable (or living with immunosuppressed people) have also been eligible for some time, and should have been contacted by local NHS services
 - **16+** can book online through the NHS National Booking System, or by calling 119.
 - **Due your 2nd jab?** Now **8 week interval**, not 12
 - Local walk-in vaccine clinics are being updated all the time
- www.kingston.gov.uk/vaccine
- 3rd jab to be given to all CEV groups over 12 years old, and to all cohorts 1-9
- booster dose to be encouraged for everyone in your networks - 6 months after 2nd jab

Stoptober

- An annual event that encourages smokers to quit for **28 days in October**, with the aim of stopping smoking for good.
- If you can make it to 28 days smoke-free, you're **5 times more likely** to quit for good
- Starts on Friday **1st October**



- **Call to Action:** help us to spread the word about Stoptober to Kingston residents, to promote smoking cessation and improve mental and physical health. You can do this by;
 - Signposting residents to the **NHS Stoptober webpage** (<https://www.nhs.uk/better-health/quit-smoking/>) for information on Stoptober and support to quit
 - Encourage residents to download the **NHS Quit Smoking App**. The app allows you to; track your progress, see how much you're saving and to get daily support
 - Signpost residents who want further support to **Kick It** - they provide FREE expert support and FREE nicotine replacement to Kingston residents wanting to quit. You can also promote Kick It via your social media channels. See suggested messaging below;
 - *"It's never too late to quit smoking. Whether you've attempted to quit before, been thinking about it for a while or are only just considering stopping, Kick It Stop Smoking Service can help you quit this Stoptober. Call 020 3434 2500 to book your appointment now. What will you start when you stop?"*
