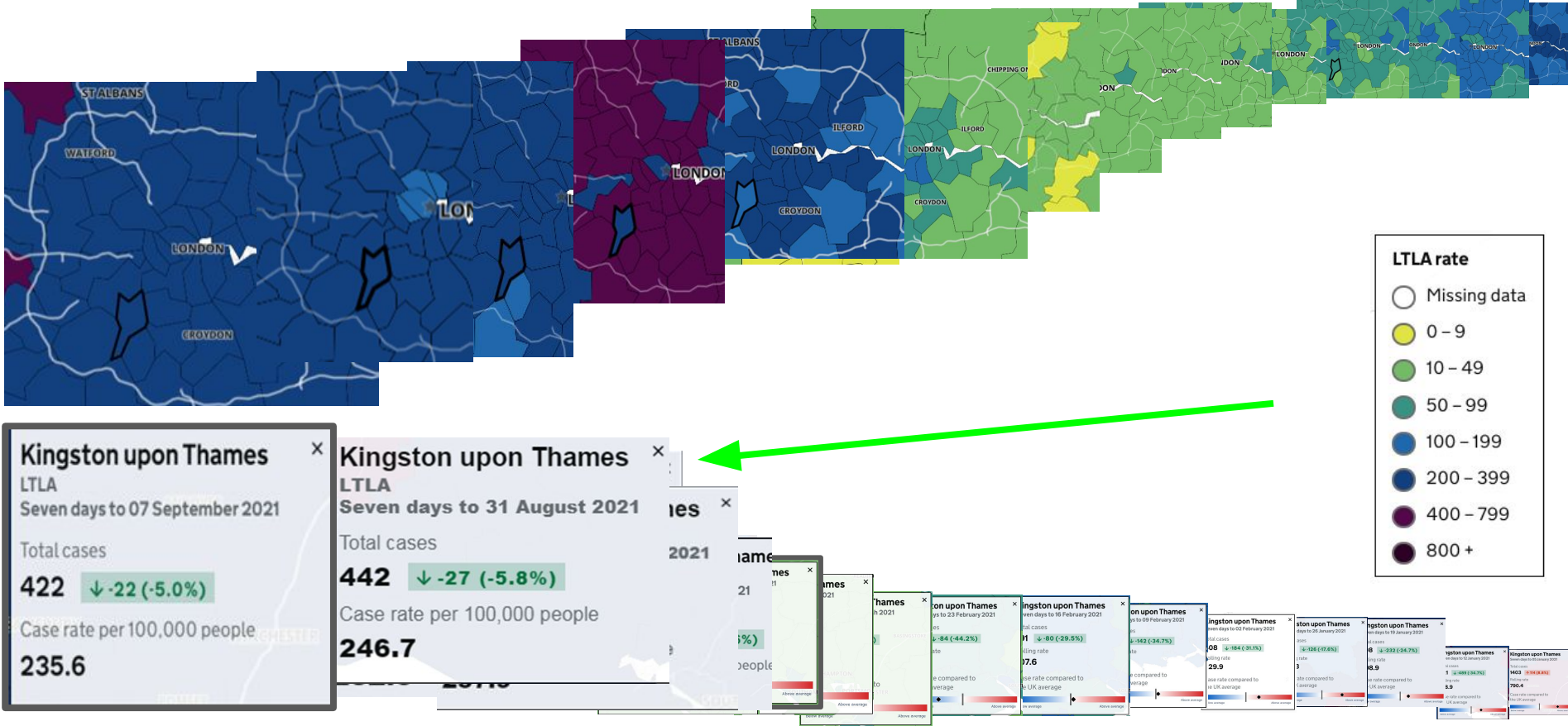

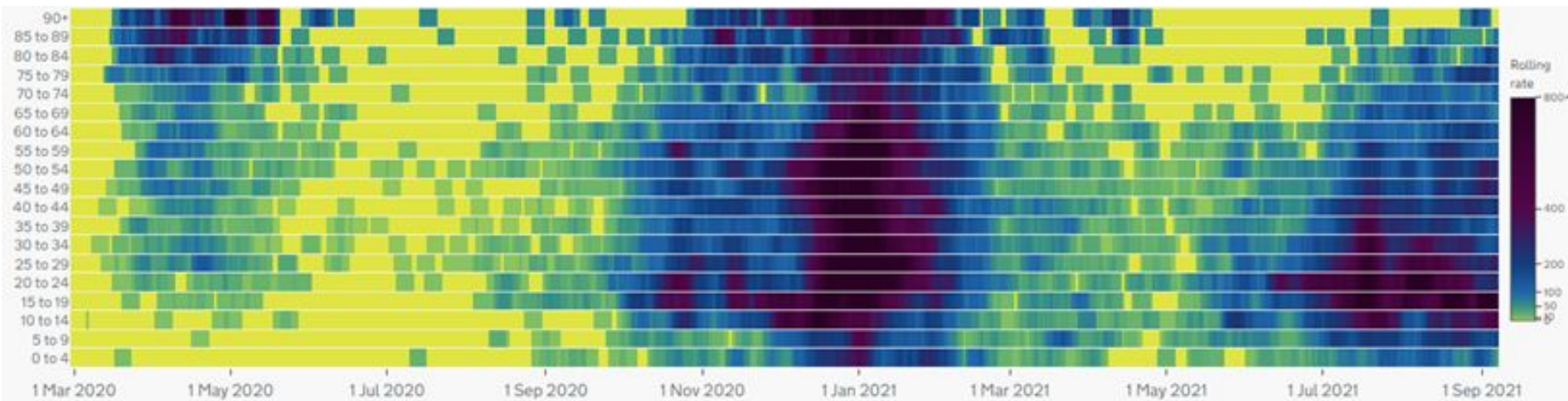
Average daily case numbers have been largely flat over the past few weeks

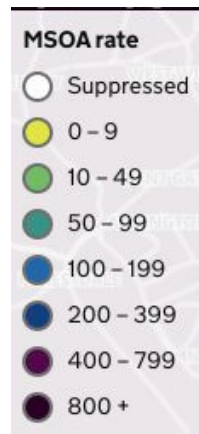
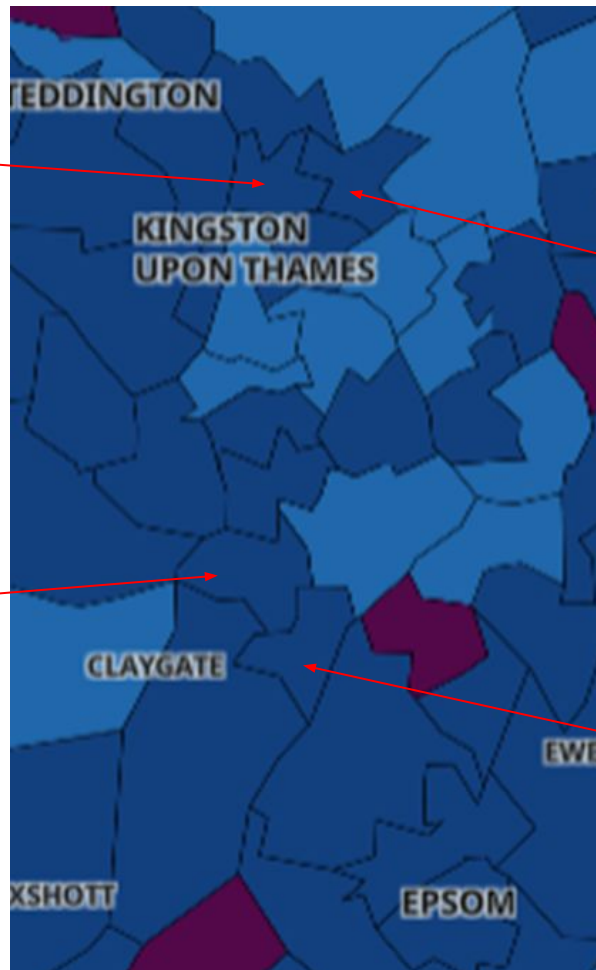

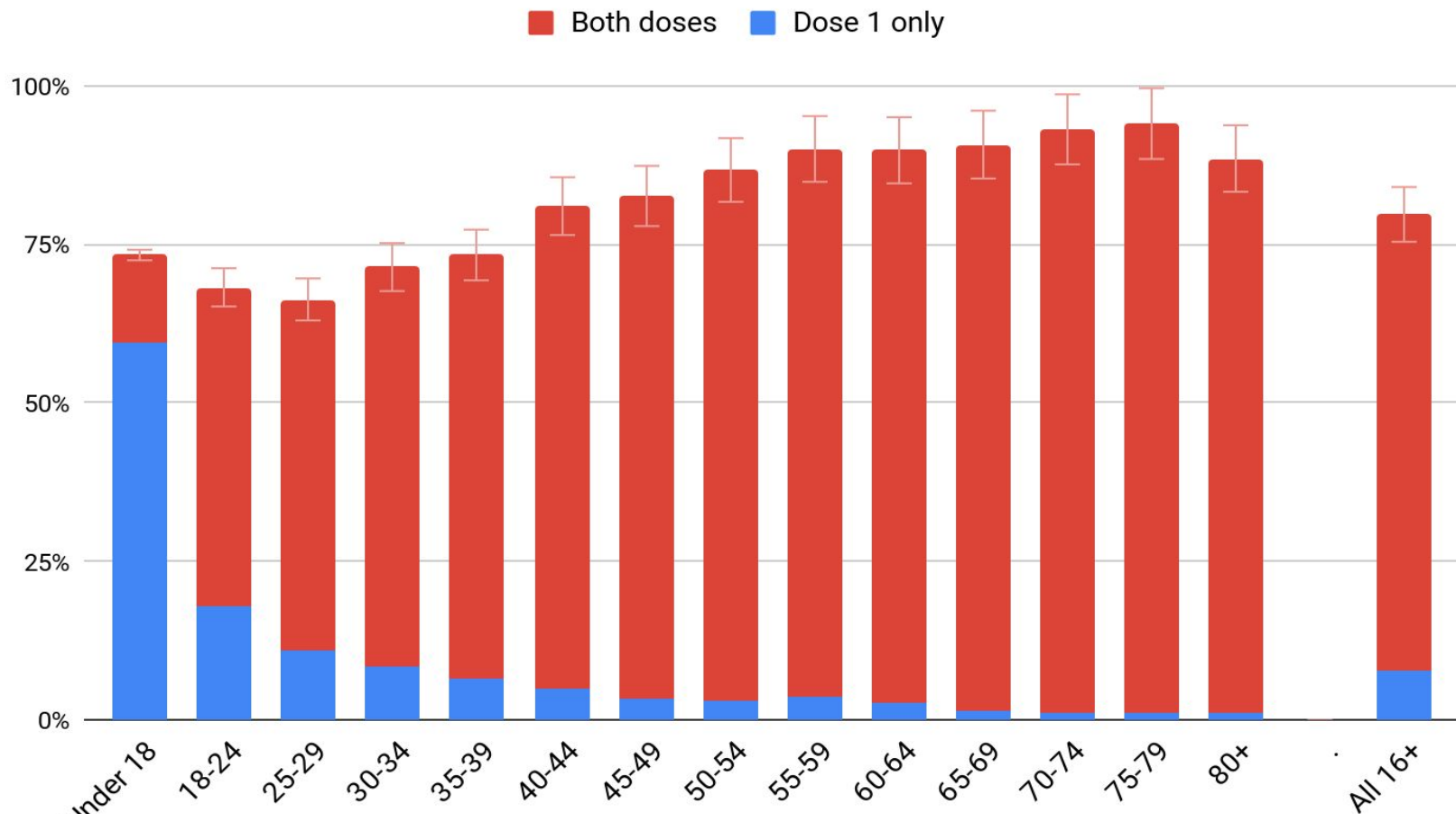

Just over 500 residents had their first dose in the week to September 5th, the lowest weekly total so far
 Four out of five (range 74-85%) of Kingston's adult population have had at least one vaccination,
 including almost three quarters of our 16 and 17 year olds.

Weekly second dose numbers have slipped a little at just under 2,000 this week, mostly 18 - 29 year olds.
 72% (range 67-77%) of adult residents are now fully protected.

Proportion of Kingston residents vaccinated to September 5th 2021, by age group



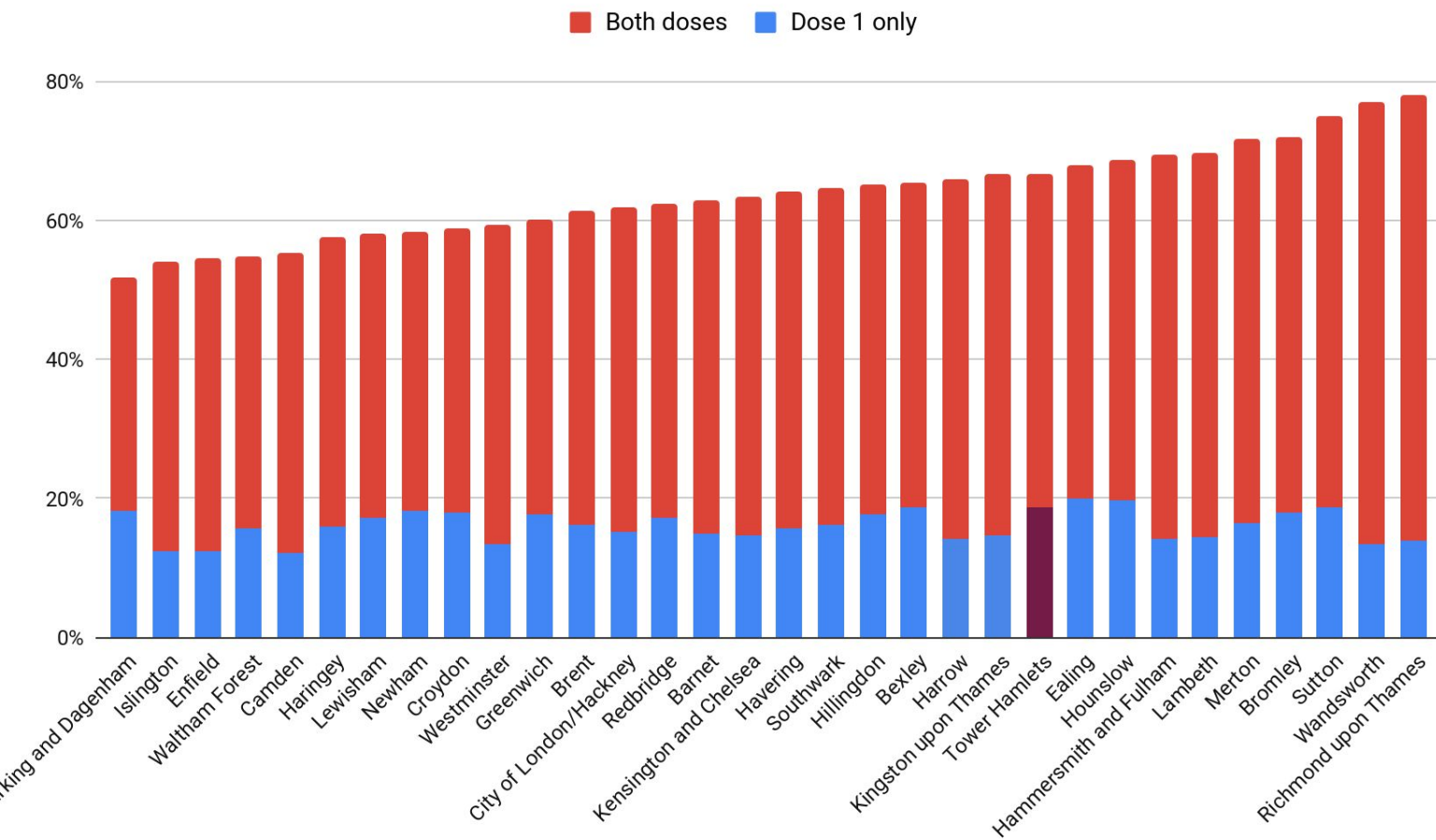

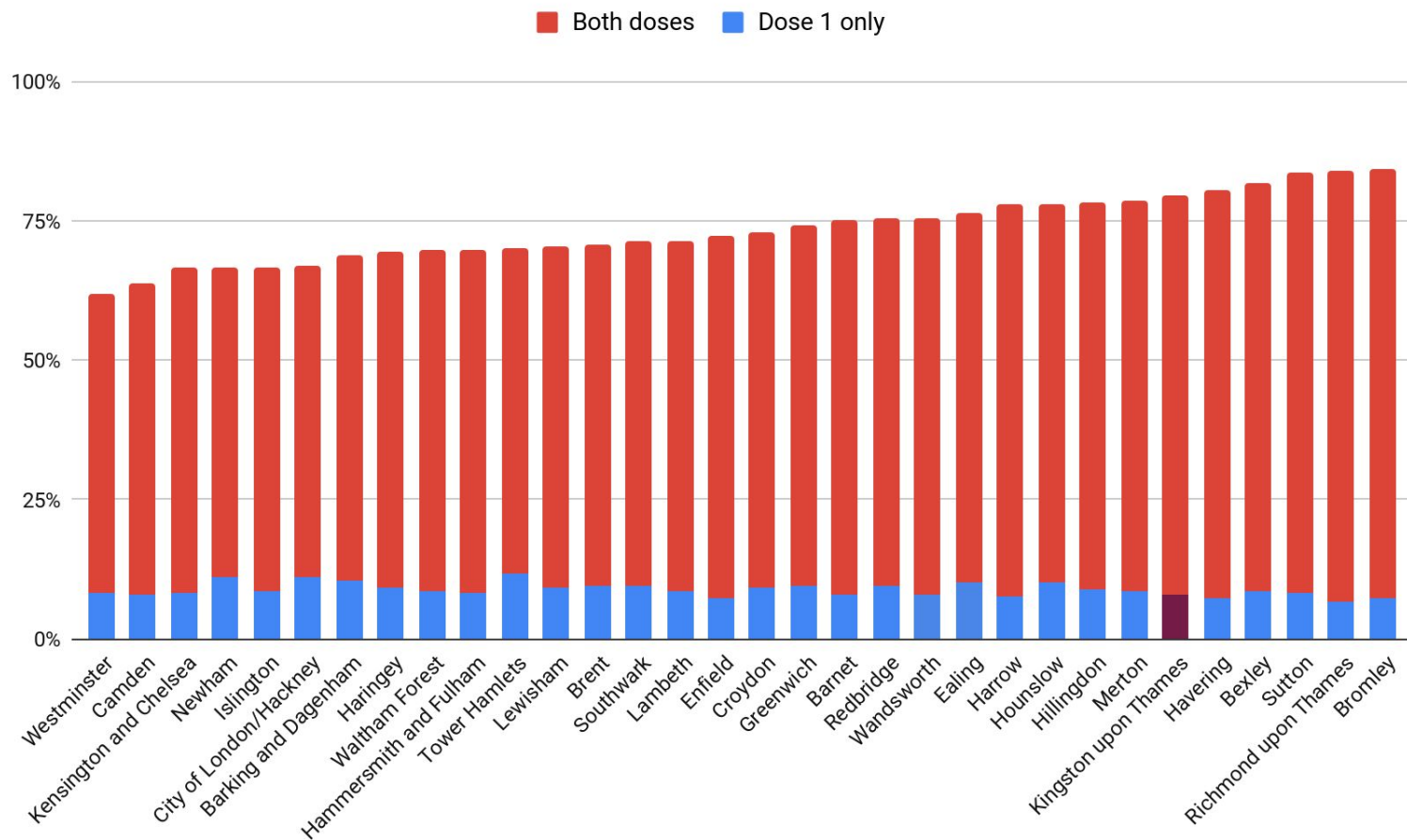

Even though Kingston's uptake is lower than the SWL average, it is still relatively high when compared to all London local authorities

Percentage of London residents vaccinated to September 5th 2021, all ages, by local authority



Kingston's uptake is one of the highest in London, and similar to our SWL neighbours, however demographic and ethnic profiles vary between boroughs, accounting for some of the variation seen

Communications messages

Return to school

- As students in England return to school, they can look forward to a more normal year – seeing their friends, getting back to sports and activities, and enjoying learning.
- To keep each other safe, pupils and their families are encouraged to keep up with twice-weekly lateral flow testing - www.kingston.gov.uk/rapid-testing
- Students aged 16 and 17, as well as younger children aged 12-15 in certain eligible groups are encouraged to take up the offer of the vaccine.

As more people return to workplaces, taking some key preventative actions remains the best way to stop the spread of the virus.

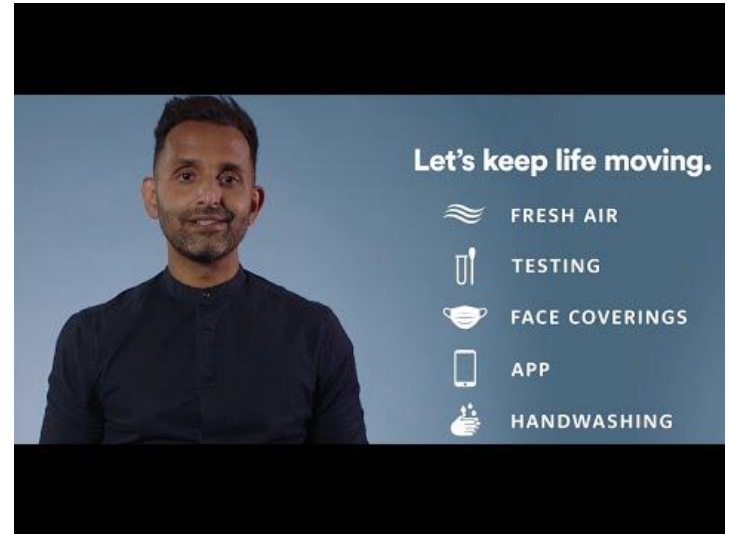
You can help keep yourself and others safe at work by:

- wearing **face coverings** on public transport, or in busy indoor spaces
- regularly **washing your hands** with warm soapy water
- keeping a **safe distance** from others wherever possible
- taking **regular rapid lateral flow tests**, twice a week - www.kingston.gov.uk/rapid-testing

Key vaccination messages



- All 16-17 year olds are now eligible for one dose of a suitable vaccine
- Everyone 16-17 should have been contacted by their GP by Monday 23 August
- Walk-in clinics in the borough now available for all eligible 16 years +
- 12-15 year old vulnerable (or living with immunosuppressed people) now eligible and should have been contacted by local NHS services
- 18+ can book online through the NHS National Booking System, or by calling 119.
- **Due your 2nd jab? Now 8 week interval, not 12**
- Local walk-in vaccine clinics are being updated all the time
- www.kingston.gov.uk/vaccine
- 3rd jab to be given to all CEV groups over 12 years old - further details expected this week


