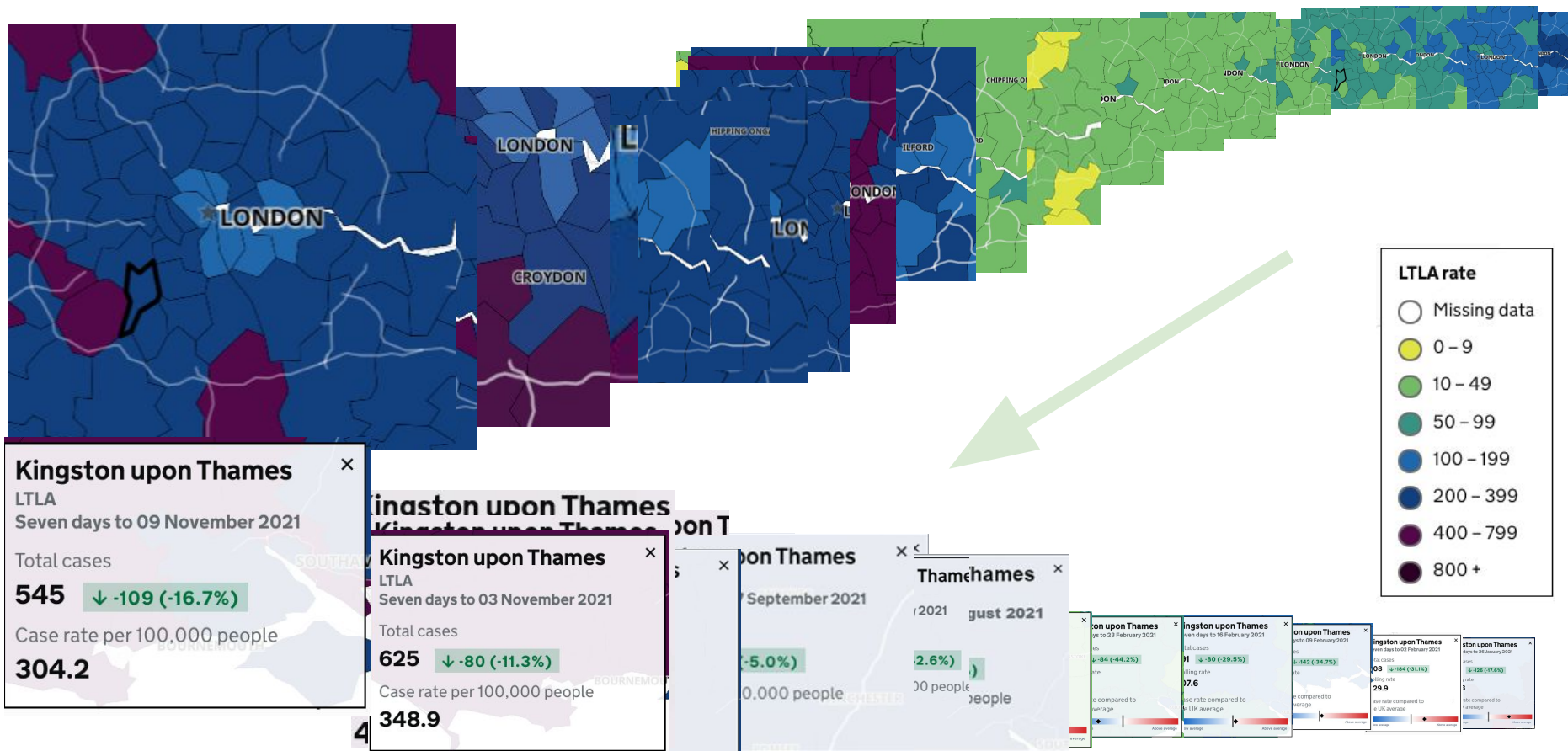

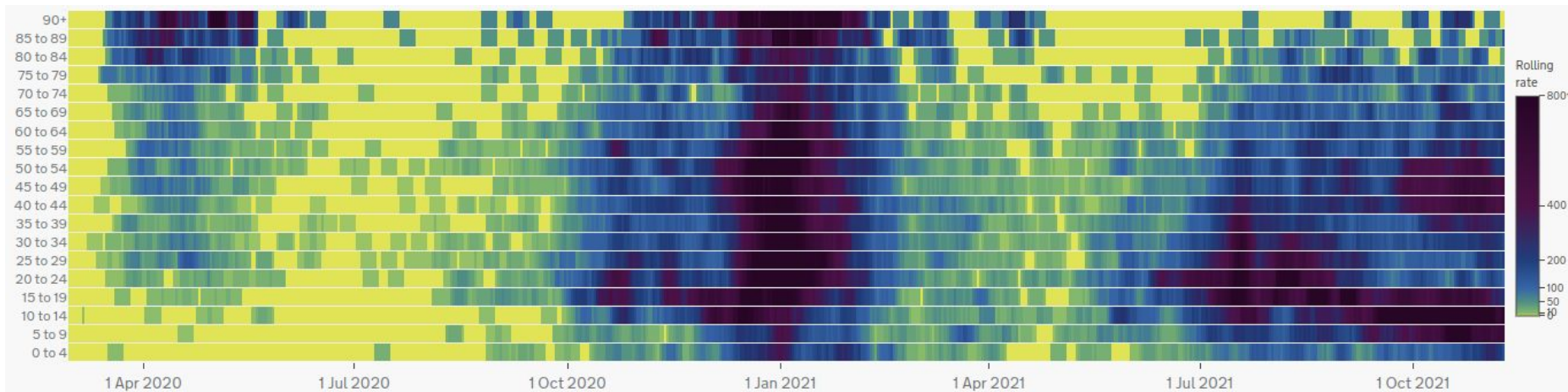

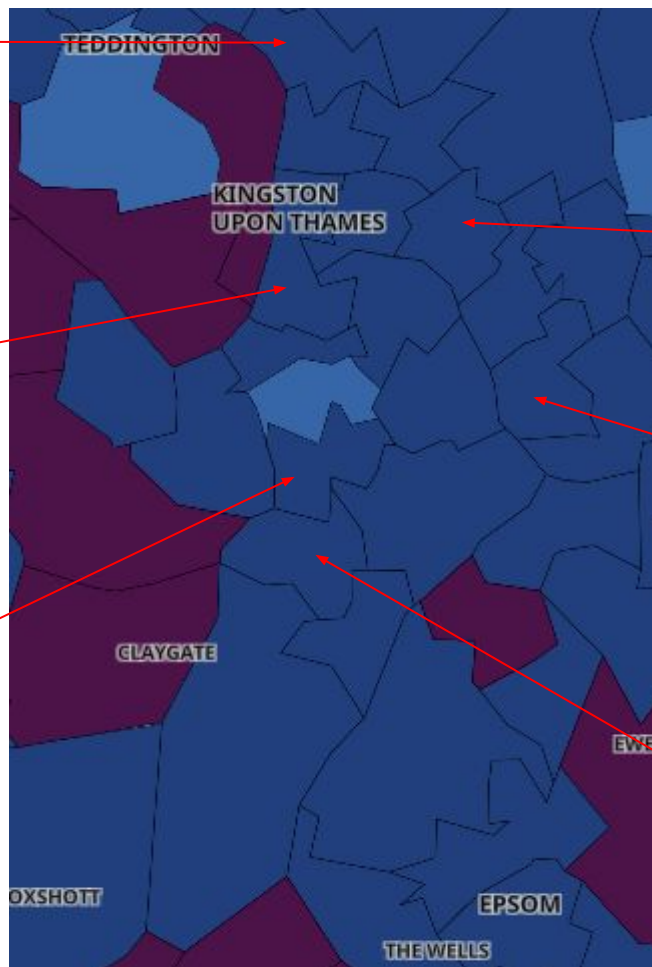

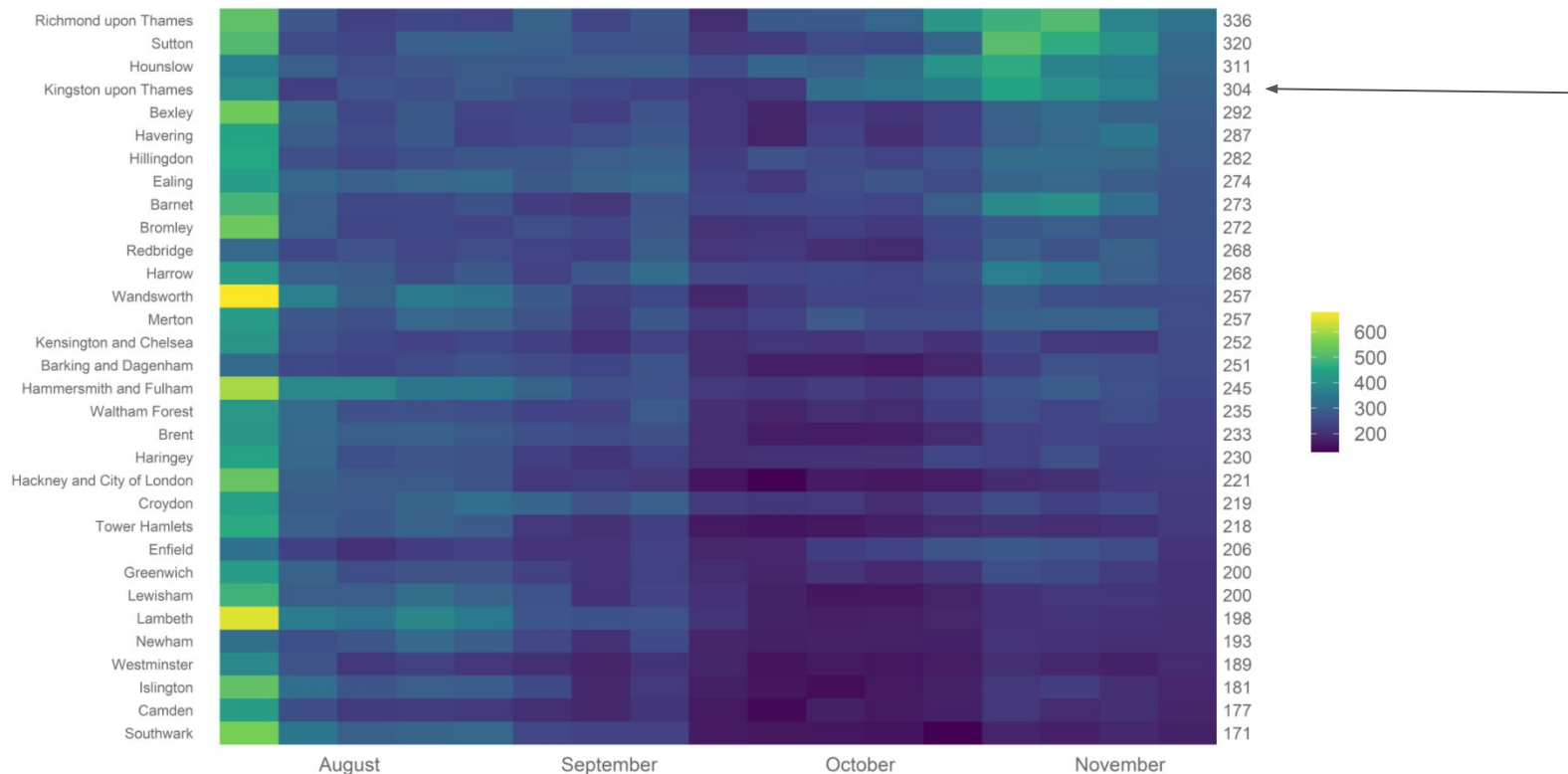

## Patients admitted to hospital

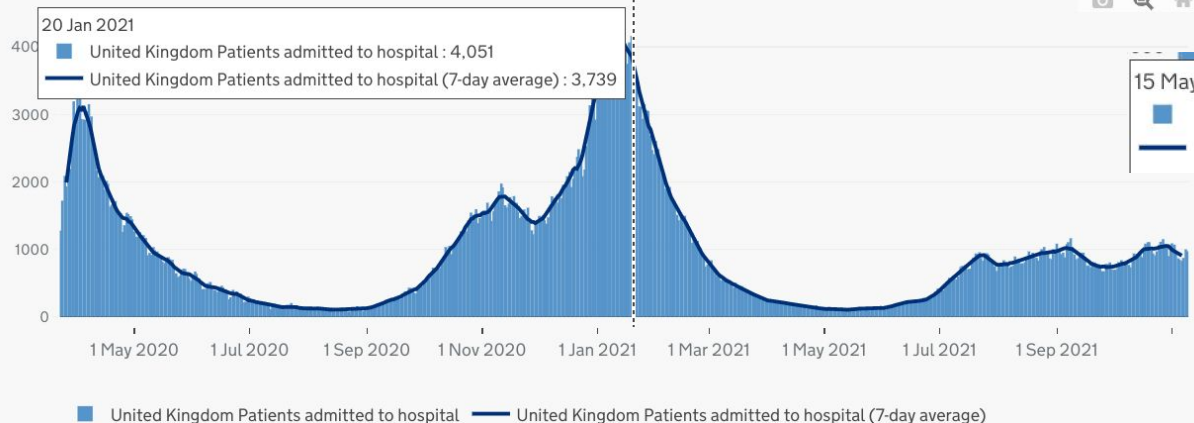

First doses are currently running at about 650 per week, most recipients are under 18  
83% (range 78-88%) of Kingston's adult population have had at least one vaccination, or 77% if we include 12-15 year olds

Weekly second dose numbers have stabilised at around 350, mostly 18 - 29 year olds.

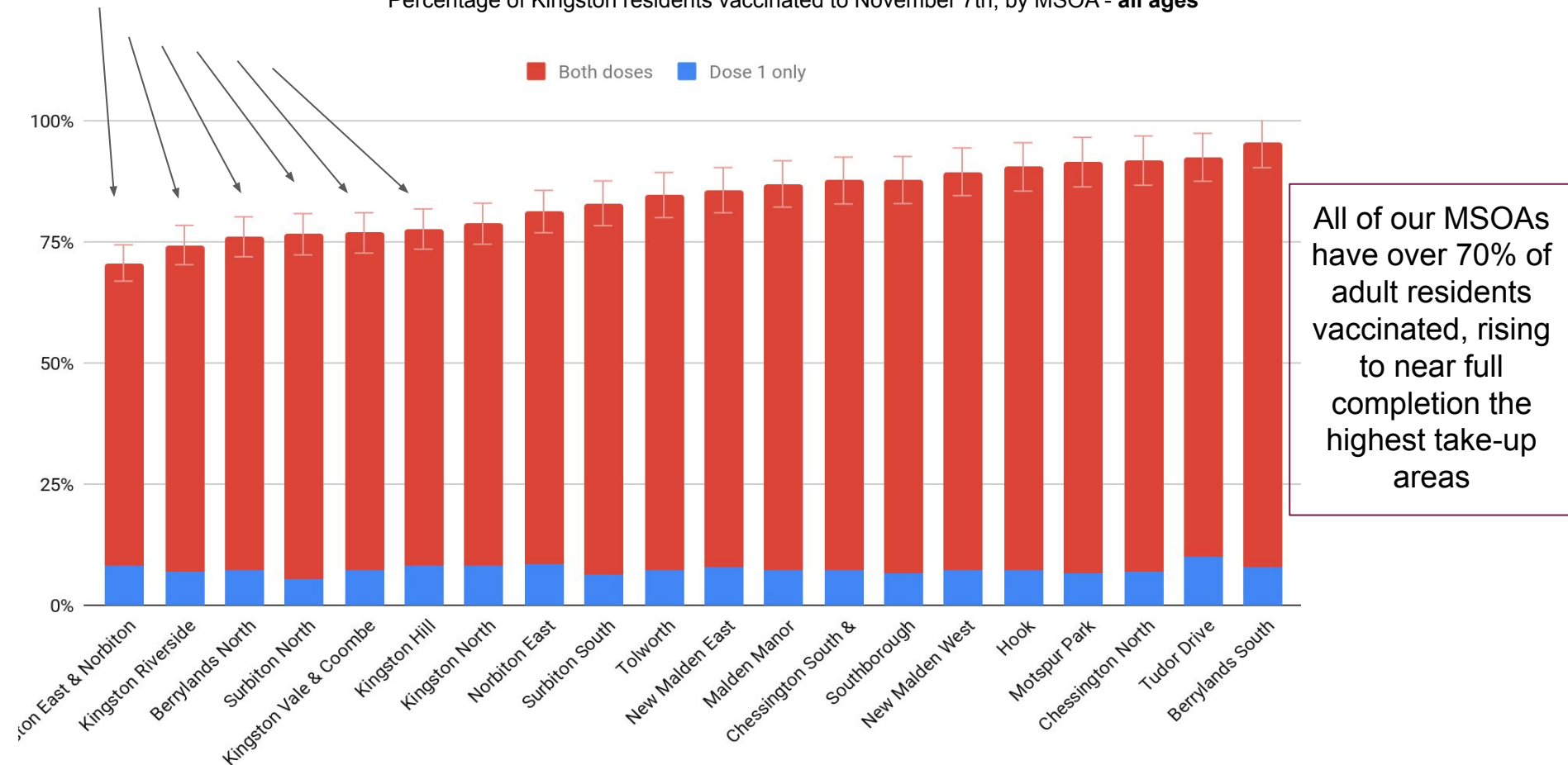
**76% (range 71-80%) of adult residents have now had 2 doses.** Help us reach the remaining 24% of adult residents

**No comparable second dose % for under 18s can be produced as not all of this group are due to be called for second doses.**

Percentage of Kingston residents vaccinated to November 7th, by MSOA - all ages

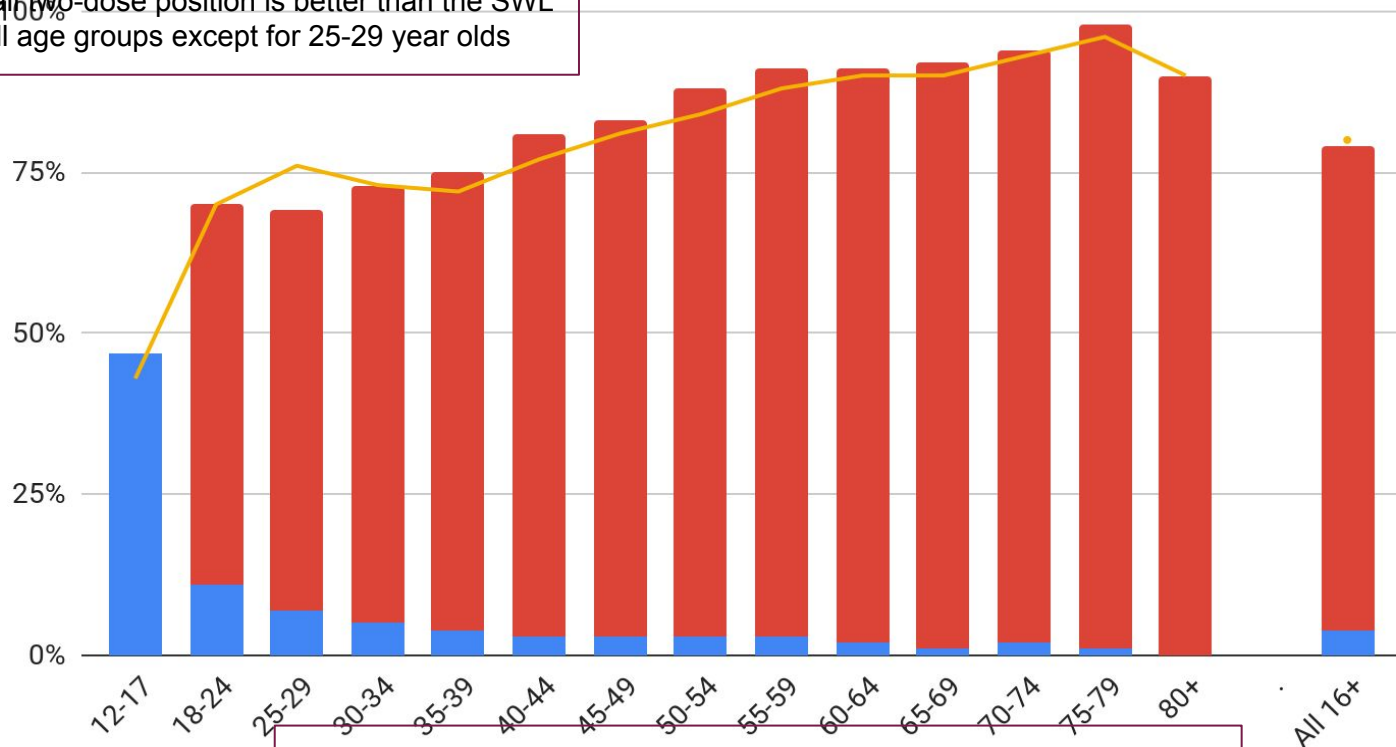


# Please help us reach the 18-29 year olds in Kingston with the vaccination messages

— SWL 1 or 2 doses   ■ RBK both doses   ■ RBK dose 1 only

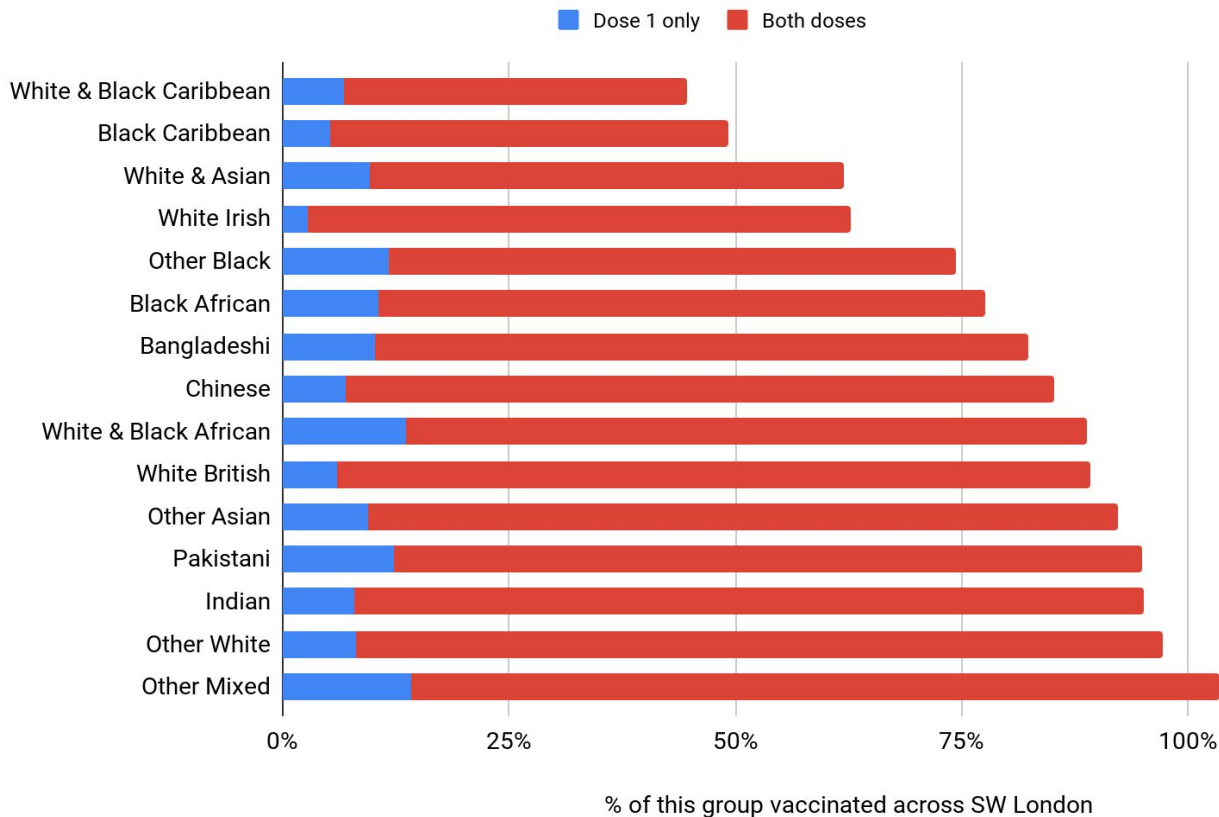
Kingston's overall two-dose position is better than the SWL average in all age groups except for 25-29 year olds

# Help us take the message and share vaccination locations with all our residents

Certain Mixed and Black groups are amongst the lowest-vaccinated overall.

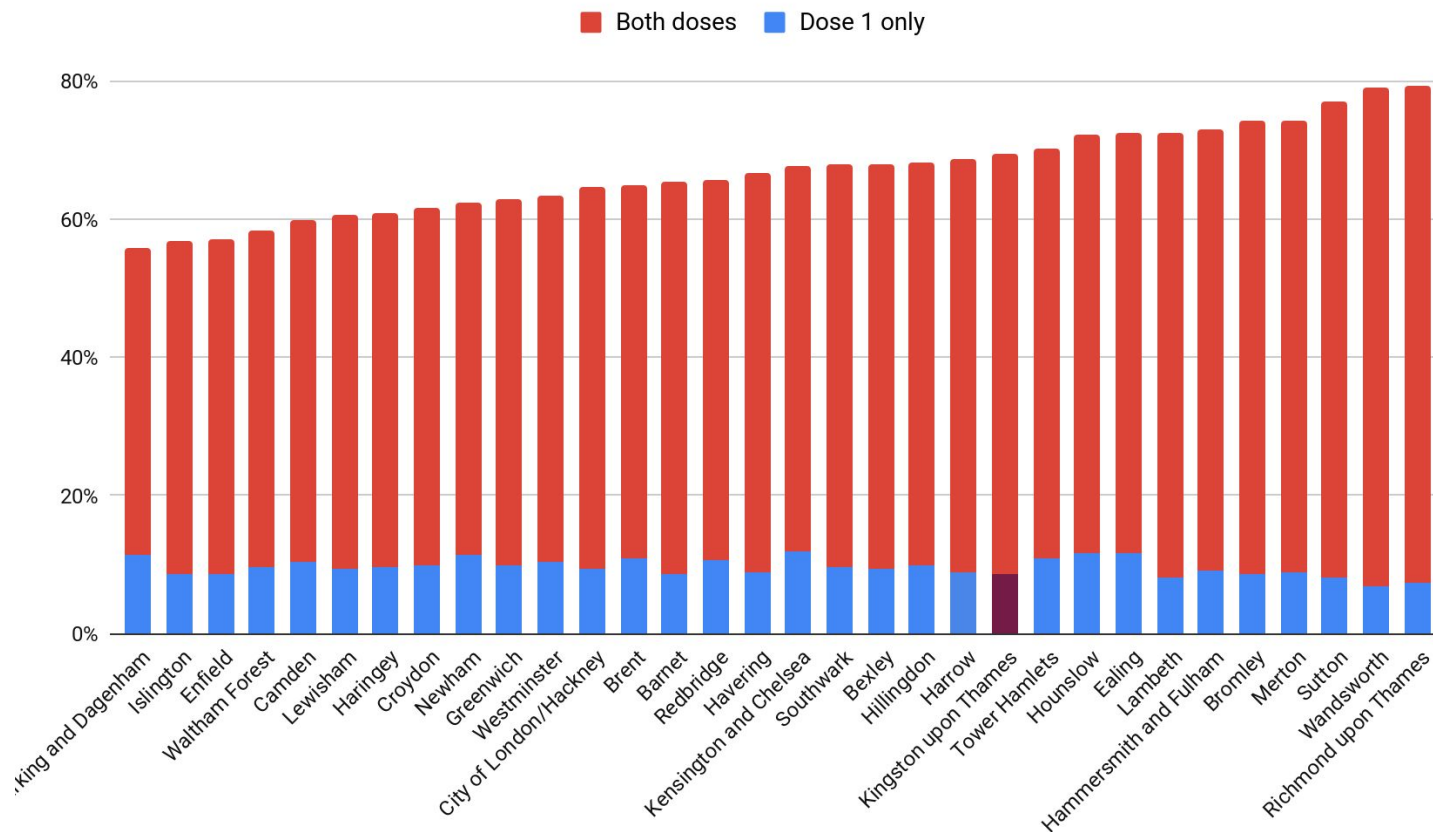
Over 40% of White & Black Caribbean residents have had a vaccine dose, rising to over 100% of the estimated Other Mixed population (which must be a low estimate).

Now all adults have been offered a vaccination, this chart gives a more rounded picture of take-up across ethnicities

N.B. the 'other ethnic group' has been removed as it is reporting well over 100% completion due to an underestimate of the size of this group

# Communications messages: we need to keep reinforcing the 'be cautious' and 'get tested' and promote the vaccination opportunity messages

- Meet up outside, or keep windows and doors open to circulate **fresh air** inside
- Take **rapid lateral flow tests** twice a week

- Wear **face coverings** on public transport, and in busy indoor spaces
- Download the **NHS COVID-19 app**
- **Wash your hands** regularly with warm soapy water

# Key vaccination messages



- All children **over 12 years** now being offered one dose of the Pfizer vaccine, and programme is underway
  - Book online through NBS, or through school offering
- Walk-in clinics in the borough also available for all eligible **12 years+** - it's never been easier
- **12+** can book online through the NHS National Booking System, or by calling 119
- **12-15 year old vulnerable** (or living with immunosuppressed people) are also eligible, and should have been contacted by local NHS services
- **2nd jab?** Now **8 week interval**, not 12. **Booster?** 6 months or 182 days after 2nd jab.
- Local walk-in vaccine clinics open for boosters **without appointment** from 1 Nov 2021

- **3rd jab** to be given to **all CEV groups over 12 years old, and to all cohorts 1-9**
  - booster dose to be encouraged for everyone in your networks

# Covid booster and Flu jab messages

- General advice is now eligible should come forward - **not wait** to be contacted by the NHS
- Online booking can still be done through the NHS National Booking System from 5 months after the 2nd dose (appointments dates bookable from 6 months), or call 119
- In addition to this in Kingston, PSM Pharmacy, Ewell Rd are also offering walk-in booster jabs to all over 50s that had their 2nd dose 6 months (182 days) ago - as well as Flu jabs (supplies allowing) - with no appointment
- Flu jabs are being offered now to all over 50s, to children, HSCW, and a number of others with long-term health conditions
- It has been agreed nationally that Covid boosters and Flu jabs **can** be co-administered
- Those waiting for their Covid booster **should not delay** getting the Flu jab - vice versa
- Evidence indicates potentially worse health outcomes for those co-infected

# Walk-in vaccinations for 12-15 year olds

All over 12s are eligible for COVID-19 vaccination

**From 1st November 2021, all local walk-in clinics have re-opened for 12-15 year olds**

Many will already have been vaccinated in schools - this offer augments existing provision, through vaccination opportunities without appointment outside schools
