


Kingston daily cases at 10/07/21 (latest data at 19/07/21)




What is the trend in Kingston for COVID-19?



Case rates/100,000/wk by age group, Kingston, 13/07/21, data at 19/07/21)




Highest rates (at 13/07/21) in:

- 25-29 (451/100,000/week)


Low rates in >65 years but some cases being seen (60-64 86/100,000/wk)



Percentage of Kingston residents vaccinated to July 11th 2021, by MSOA - 18-29 year olds






The MSOAs have been split into five groups, with four areas in each group

Darker colours reflect a lower first dose uptake

A slightly different pattern can be seen in younger residents

Healthcare: London Hospital Daily COVID-19 Admissions, 19/07/21



- 66 admissions per day in London (11 July 2021) vs 11.6/day on the 3rd May 2021 (ie x 5 increase)
- becoming hospital admissions at the same rate as previously in 2020 (about a third of when cases were at the current level around 230 admissions per day in London in early/mid December 2020)

ACTION: Encourage young people with symptoms to get tested



- Our case rates in Kingston are highest in young people
- ACTION: Encourage young people to get a test

- 'Don't guess, get a test'

 18+ can now book their vaccinations online through the NHS National Booking System



If you're aged over 18, a carer or have an underlying health condition, call 119 or visit nhs.uk/covid-vaccination to book your COVID-19 vaccination appointment.

- 40+? Book your second jab now 8 week interval, not 12
- There will be a vaccine pop-up at Kings Meadow later this week, details TBC
- Local walk-in vaccine clinics are being updated all the time


