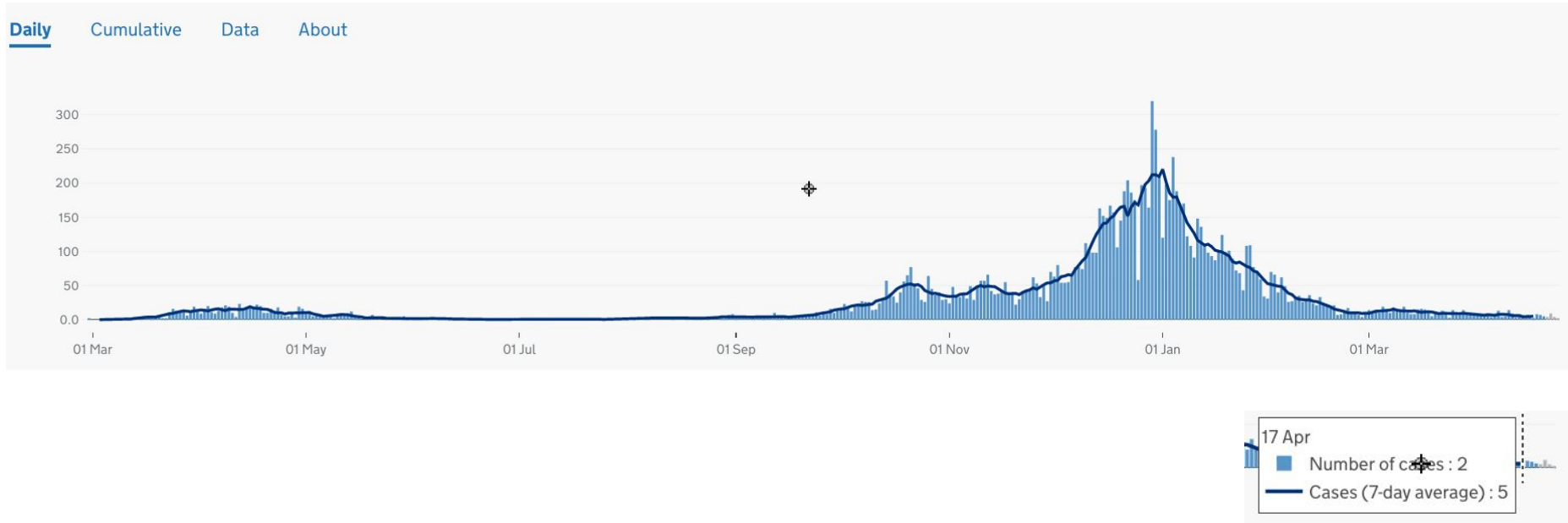


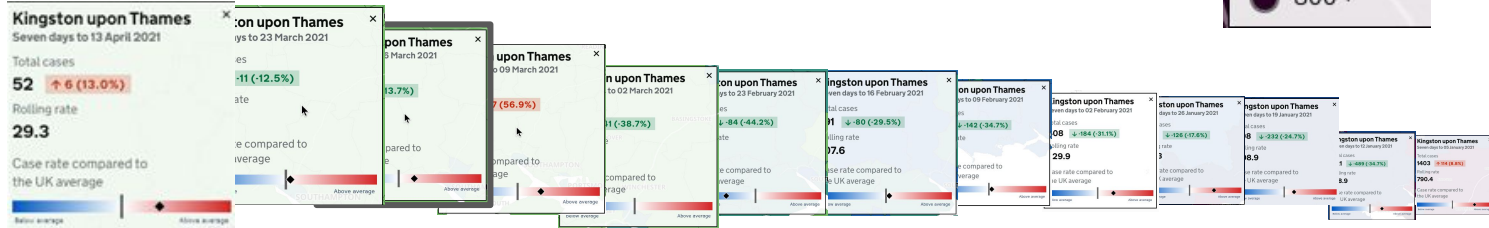
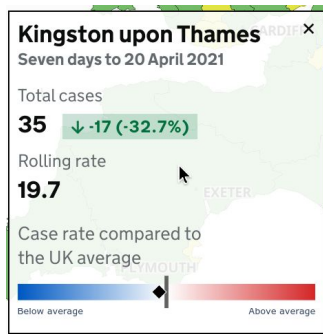

A map of London with the word 'LONDON' in the center. A black outline in the west of the city indicates the study area. A white hand icon points to the word 'LONDON'.

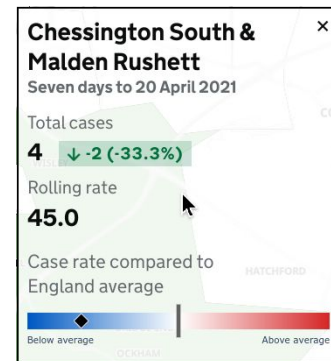
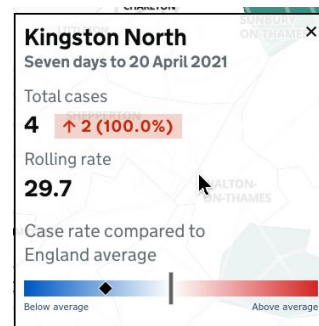
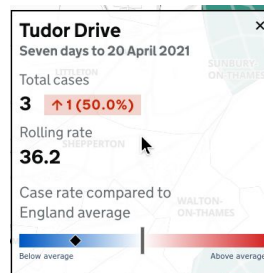
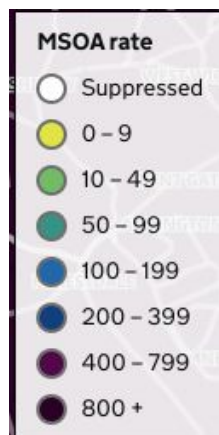
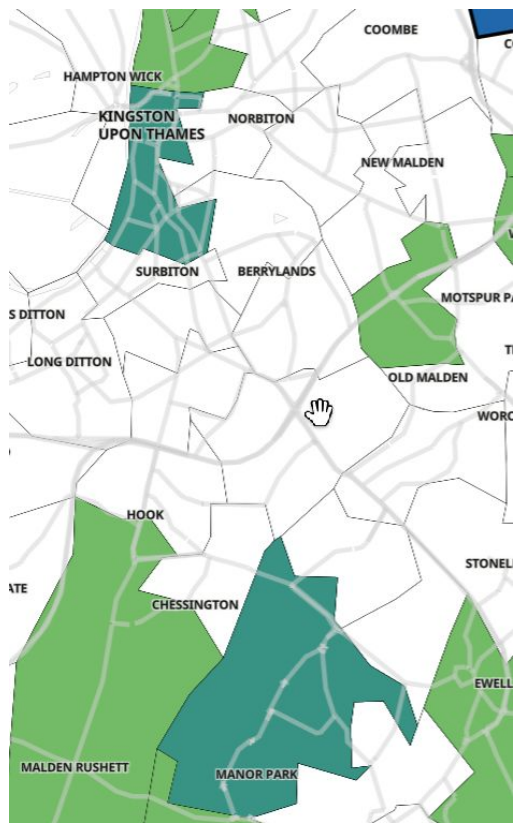

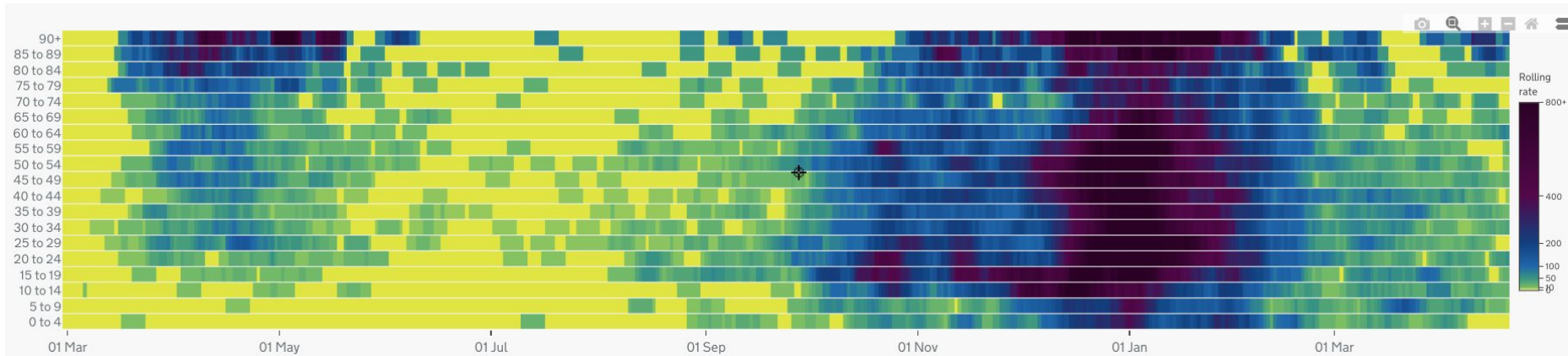

Key messages for everyone

- We've now moved to step two of the government's roadmap out of lockdown.
- As we reopen more sections of society and the economy, it's really important we do all we can to suppress the spread of the virus - to keep each other safe we must **stick to the rules**, follow the **preventative behaviours**, **get tested** regularly and **get vaccinated** when it's our turn.
- Please remember, if you have **any symptoms of COVID-19** - a high temperature, a new or continuous cough, or a loss or change in your sense of taste or smell - you must **self isolate** and **book a test** straight away at nhs.uk/coronavirus or 119



Key messages for everyone

- You can meet those outside your household **outdoors, in groups of up to 6 people**, or two households.
- You should try to **stay local** where possible, and continue to **work from home** where possible.
- You should continue to keep a 2 metre distance from people from outside your household or support bubble.
- Remember to check into businesses using the NHS App or be prepared to leave your name and contact details for all members of your party over 16 years of age

RAPID TESTING - now for everyone in England

Everyone in England without symptoms can access free, rapid coronavirus tests twice a week to check whether they unknowingly have the virus.



- **1-in-3 people who have coronavirus don't have any symptoms**, but could still be infectious and can pass it on to others without realising.
- Regular twice-weekly testing is crucial to reopening our society and the economy, helping to suppress the virus and control the spread of variants.

Collect your rapid test kits from any of our local test sites between 2.30pm and 8pm daily, including weekends:

- Milner Road, Kingston
- Cocks Crescent, New Malden
- Hawker Centre, Kingston

You can also collect test kits from RBK-run test sites: at the Market House, or the Mobile Testing Vans in the community.

Try to avoid busy testing sites.



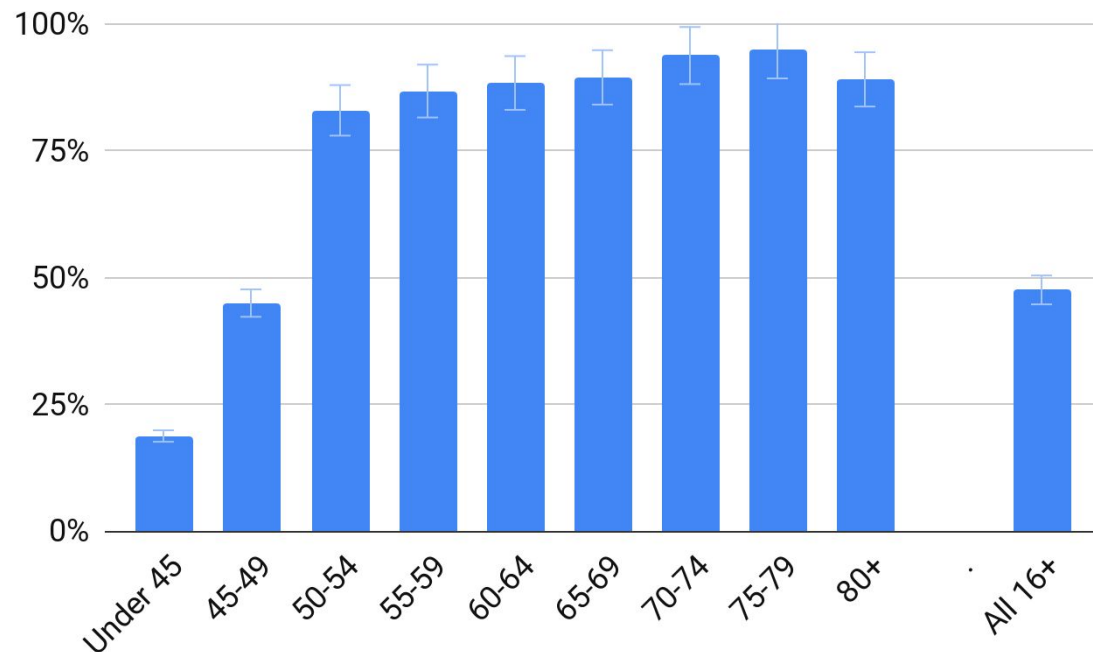
RBK Mobile Testing Team

- We have two mobile testing teams that are getting out into the heart of communities
- They offer rapid testing on site - especially helpful for those who have not self tested before or do not want to test at home
- They are distributing and explaining how to use home test kits to make access to testing as easy as possible
- Positive responses from residents when the team have visited the Hook Centre, Piper Hall, Surbiton High Street and School Lane in Tolworth

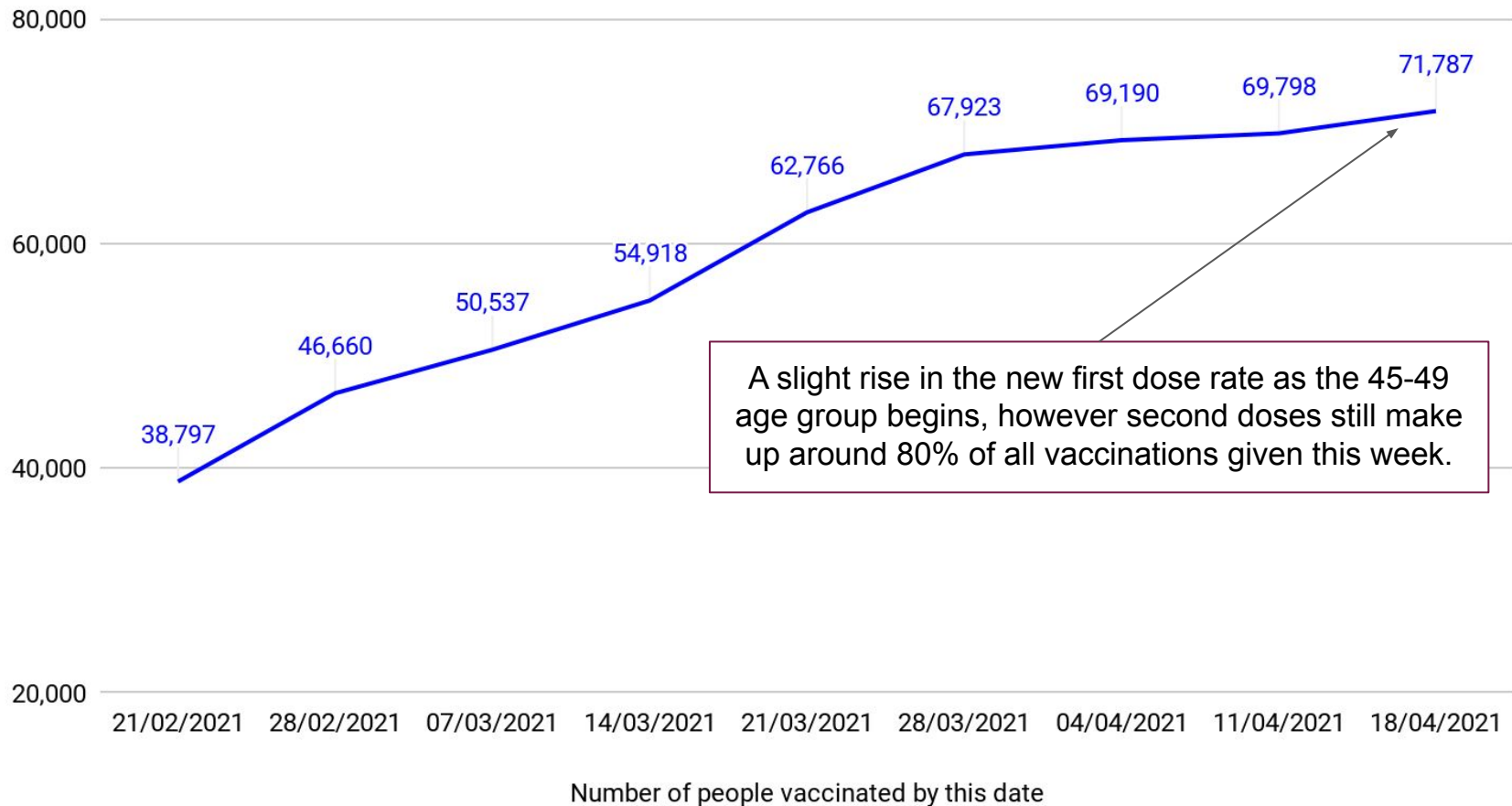


80% (range 75 - 84%) of Kingston residents aged 45 and over had been vaccinated by 18th April 2021

Almost half of the entire borough adult (age 16+) population (range 46 - 51%) had been vaccinated by that date

Vaccine - Who's Eligible Right Now?

You no longer need to wait to be contacted if you fall within one of the following groups:

- People aged **44** and over
- People at high risk from coronavirus (clinically extremely vulnerable)
- People at moderate risk from coronavirus (clinically vulnerable)
- People who live or work in care homes
- Those listed on the GP Learning Disability Register

You can **book an appointment at a vaccination centre on the NHS website.**

- If you are in receipt of, or eligible for Carer's Allowance, you will receive a letter inviting you for vaccination
- Those on the NHS shielded patient list will also receive a letter

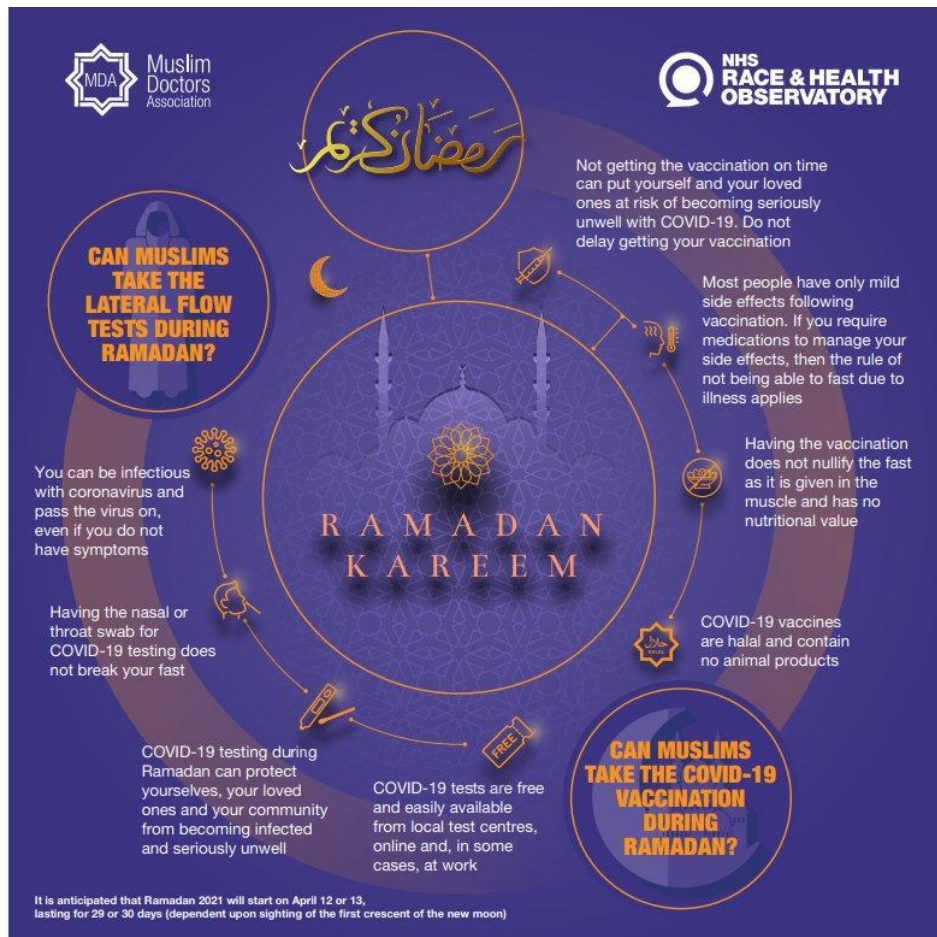
Ramadan: vaccine and testing do not break the fast

COVID-19 **TESTING & VACCINATION** during Ramadan

Fasting plays an important feature in Islam, as it does in many other religions. In Islam, adult Muslims, who are able to, are required to fast during the month of Ramadan. This year is different due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

As COVID-19 testing and vaccination appointments continue during the fasting month, and the new lateral flow test becomes available nationally from 9 April 2021, some Muslims have raised questions.

Key points relating to the uptake of testing and vaccination during Ramadan are presented right.



ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASICS - HANDS - FACE - SPACE & VENTILATION

- **Keep rooms well ventilated.**
The virus is spread through aerosol particles in the air, so opening windows regularly can cut the amount of virus present in the air in any room.
- **Even once you've had your coronavirus vaccination**, you must continue to follow all the guidance to control the virus and save lives.
