



## Kingston daily cases at 29/05/21 (latest data at 07/06/21)







# What is the trend in Kingston for COVID-19?


## Kingston Hot Spots, 01/06/21 (data at 07/06/21)












Almost 5,000 Kingston residents in their 30s had their first dose in the week to May 30th, over half of our 30-39 year olds have now been vaccinated

Around three quarters (range 69-77%) of our over 50s are now fully vaccinated

# Key messages for everyone

- Kingston has seen a sharp rise in cases of coronavirus in recent weeks
- The Delta variant is becoming increasingly dominant across London, as well as around the UK
- We are implementing an increased level of response to address the situation
- To help stop the spread we are escalating <u>our testing programme</u>, and are looking at ways to further increase our vaccination rollout where possible
- We are supporting those who test positive with practical and financial help to self-isolate

#### **ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASICS - HANDS - FACE - SPACE & FRESH AIR**

#### Keep rooms well ventilated.

The virus is spread through aerosol particles in the air, so opening windows regularly can cut the amount of virus present in the air in any room.

### Wear a face covering.

In shops, hairdressers, barbers, on public transport and in other indoor spaces where social distancing is hard.

#### Question 2

Really hard. They have suffered so much with mental health etc not being able to mix or socialise. Really hard to get them to self isolate What follow up is done on people self-isolating?

encouraging handwriting cards

Money or vouchers. Reward.

Online activities to keep them busy/support for people to talk to/information that explains clearly why they need to isolate

use the test and trace type of phone contact or send WhatsApp or other social media messages to help them feel less isolated. It will be reassuring and nice for them to receive such messages.

Ultimately this will be about communicating with their employers as many 18-30 in insecure work and do not have freedom within their terms to not go to work (e.g. zero hours contracts)

Make sure info about Kingston together is widely advertised so people know that there is support if they need to isolate

Provide a buddying system to talk to young people at home and keep them happy

use other young people self isolating to support each other in hobbies, skills and talents at home

use music messaging and poetry

Money, financial Citizens Advice Kingston receiving enquiries Increasing daily.
