Balance supports people with Learning disabilities, our supported living service is non CQC. We would really like a weekly testing schedule for these staff also. We support 90 people in the community. Is this something that can happen?	The council is working to increase access to new testing for care staff with no symptoms (asymptomatic testing) who are not currently eligible for the existing national systems. The tests will be the new 'Lateral Flow' tests (LFTs). More details will be sent to providers shortly. Providers should also check if they are eligible for the national system. Meeting others and care

1 in 3 people who have coronavirus have no symptoms and will be spreading it without realising it.

You can leave home to visit people in your support bubble, or to provide informal childcare for children aged 13 and under as part of a childcare bubble, to provide care for vulnerable people, to provide emergency assistance, attend a support group (of up to 15 people), or for respite care where that care is being provided to a vulnerable person or a person with a disability, or is a short break in respect of a looked after child.
