Questions	Answers
How can we encourage staff to have the vaccine?	Thank you for your query. Deciding whether to have the vaccine is a personal choice for everyone, but it is understandable that in certain settings there may be extra pressure to encourage as many people as possible to have it, in order to protect the most vulnerable people in that setting.
	Two key strategies we would recommend to encourage vaccine uptake are: 1) Ensuring your staff are as well informed as possible, and 2) Leading by example.
	To this end, we recommend directing your staff to good quality, reliable and non-biased sources of information. 	It is also important to guide your staff away from misleading sources of "fake news" and encourage them to be critical of certain disreputable sources of information, such as social media.
	To lead by example, encourage managers or other members of staff who have had the vaccine to discuss this openly with colleagues to help reassure and allay their fears.

What provision is being made to vaccinate those who, through physical or mental difficulty, are unable to visit a centre?	Thank you for your query. For all patients who are housebound, vaccination will be offered via their GP, as part of community vaccination programme which is being rolled out alongside the programme delivered through hospital hubs. For this reason, it is imperative that all individuals wishing to be vaccinated are registered with a GP and, if they are unable to visit the GP practice, they must ensure this is documented in their medical record.
