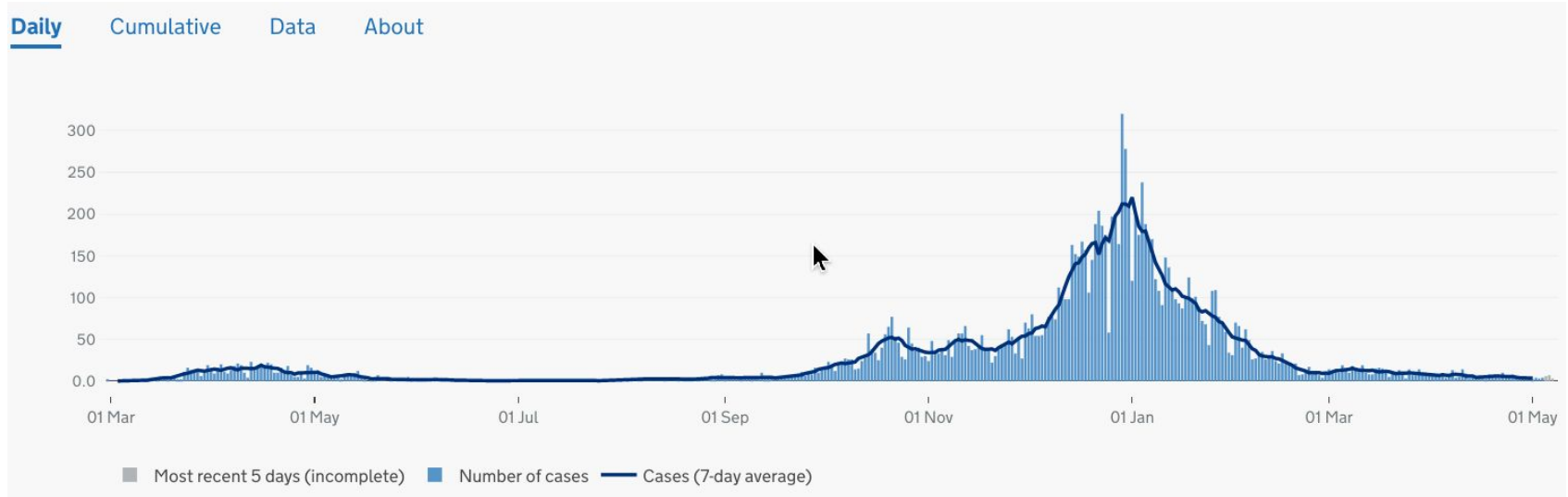

# Kingston daily cases at 01/05/21 (latest data at 10/05/21)

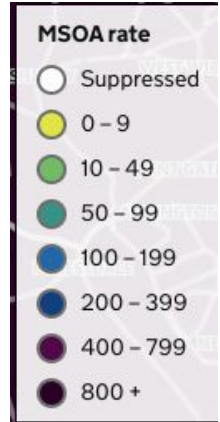
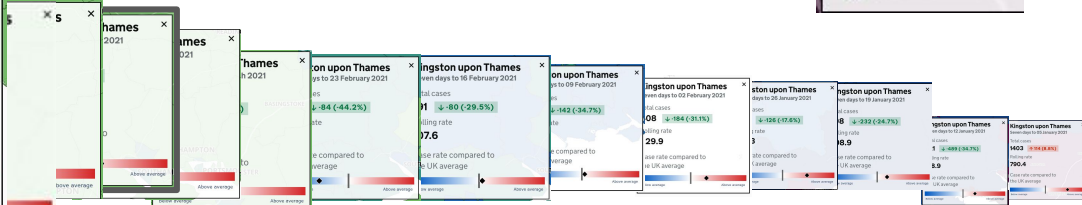
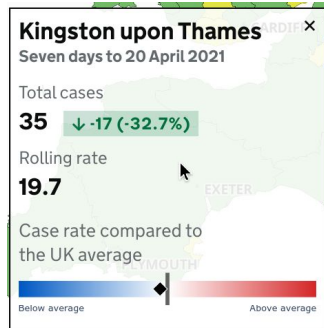
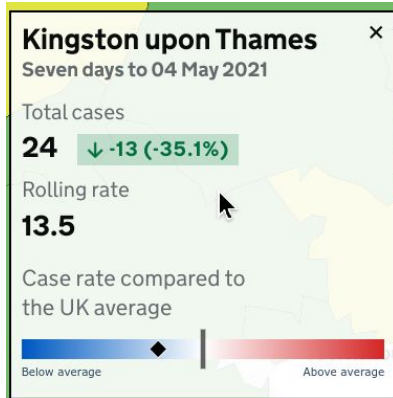
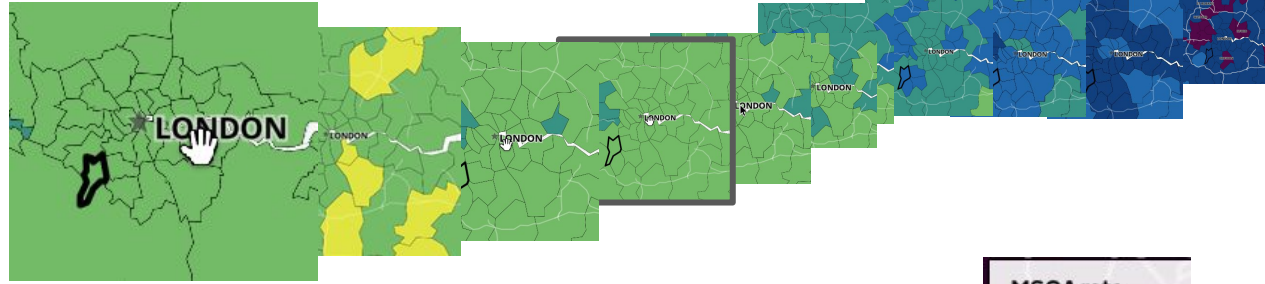
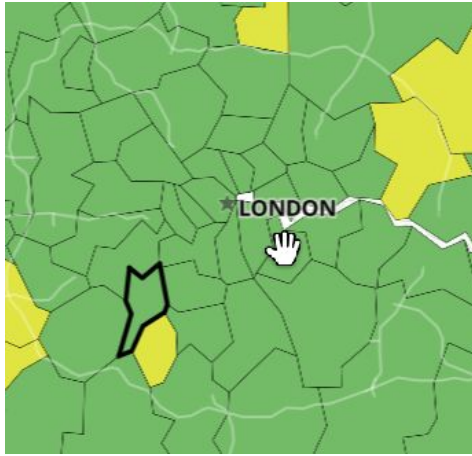

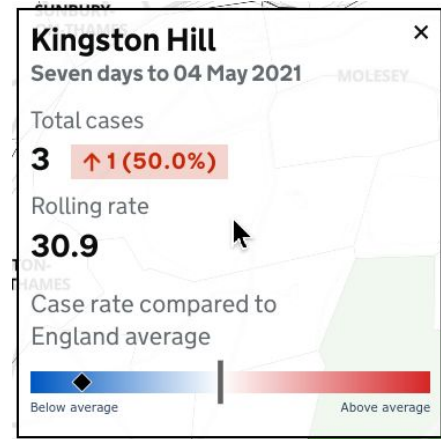
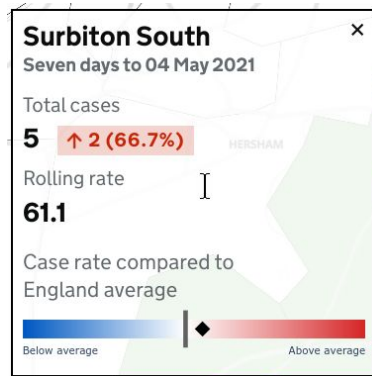
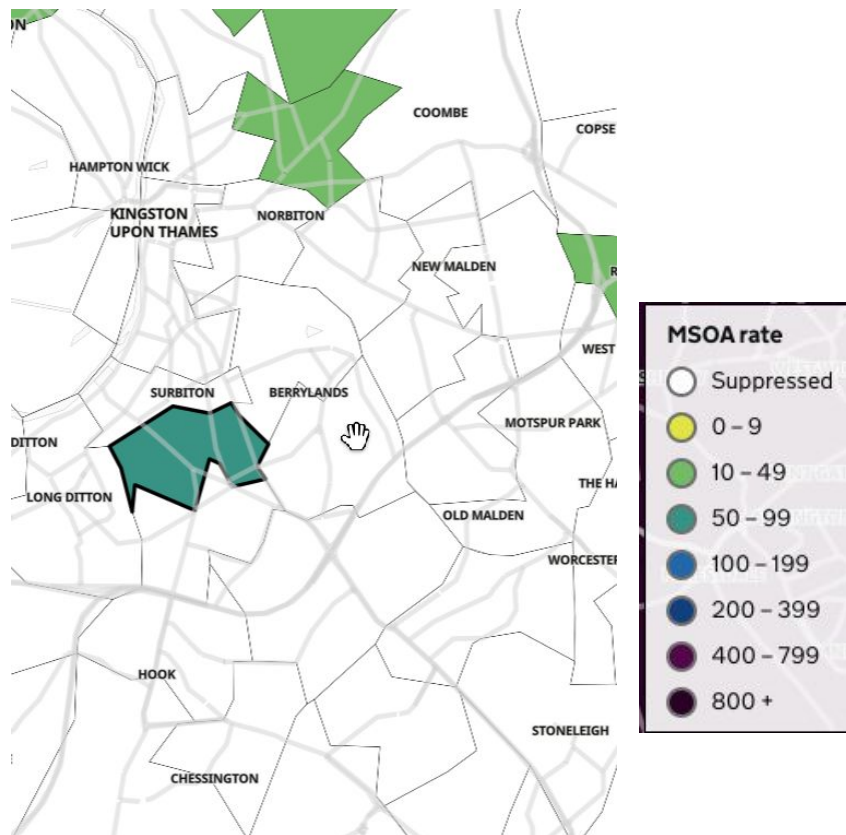

# What is the trend in Kingston for COVID-19?



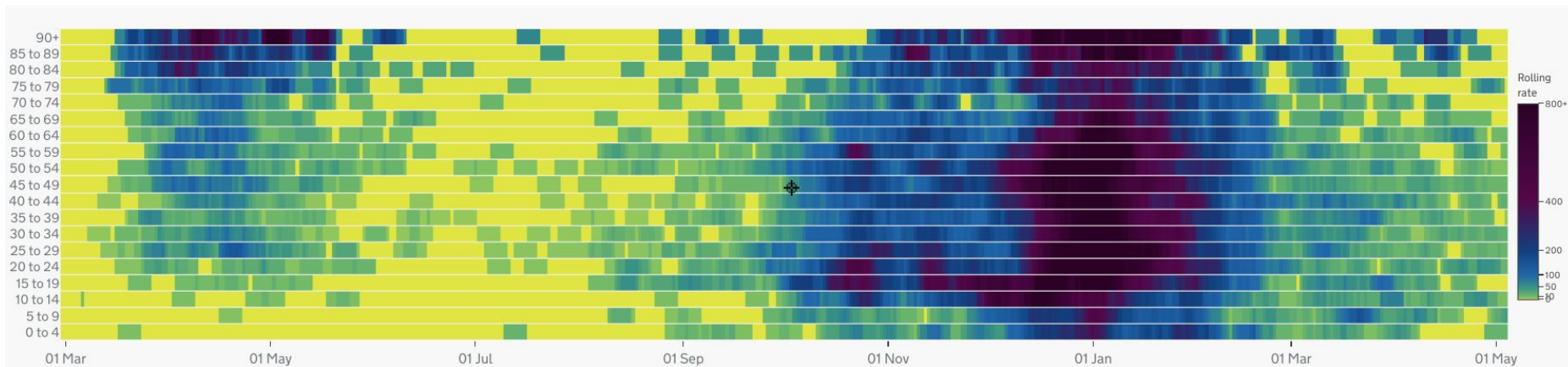

## Case rates/100,000/wk by age group, Kingston, 04/05/21, data at 10/05/21)

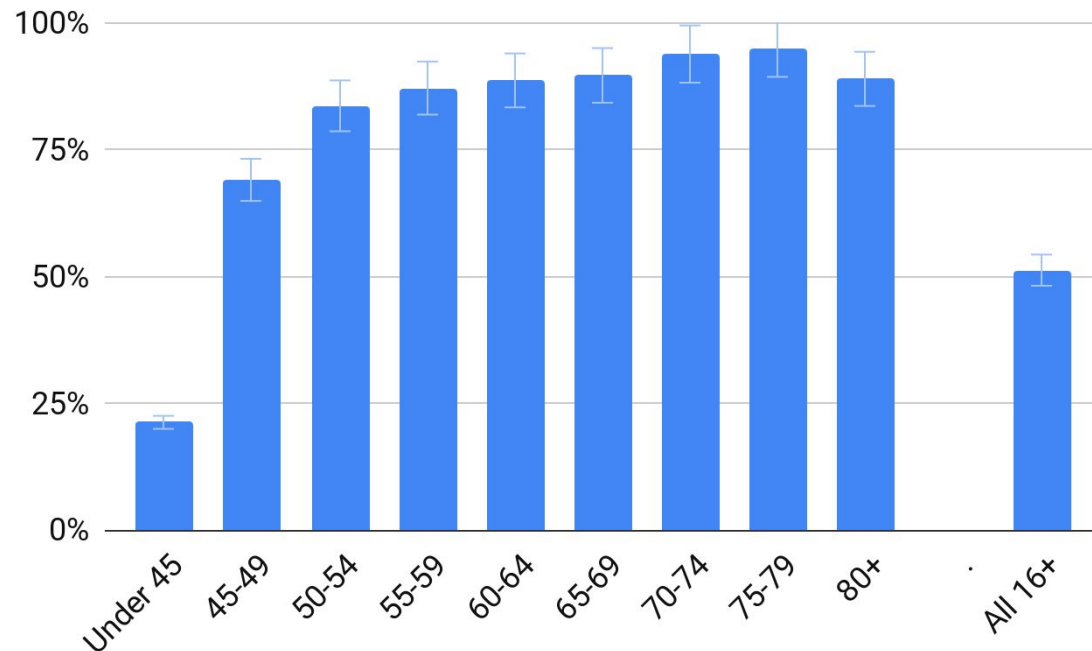


- Rates have reduced in older people's age categories with all categories showing rate of 0 except 75-79 yr olds (rate of 22.8)
- Most school age groups are below the borough average 0-4 (0), 5-9 (41.8), 10-14 (9.2) 15-19 (0)

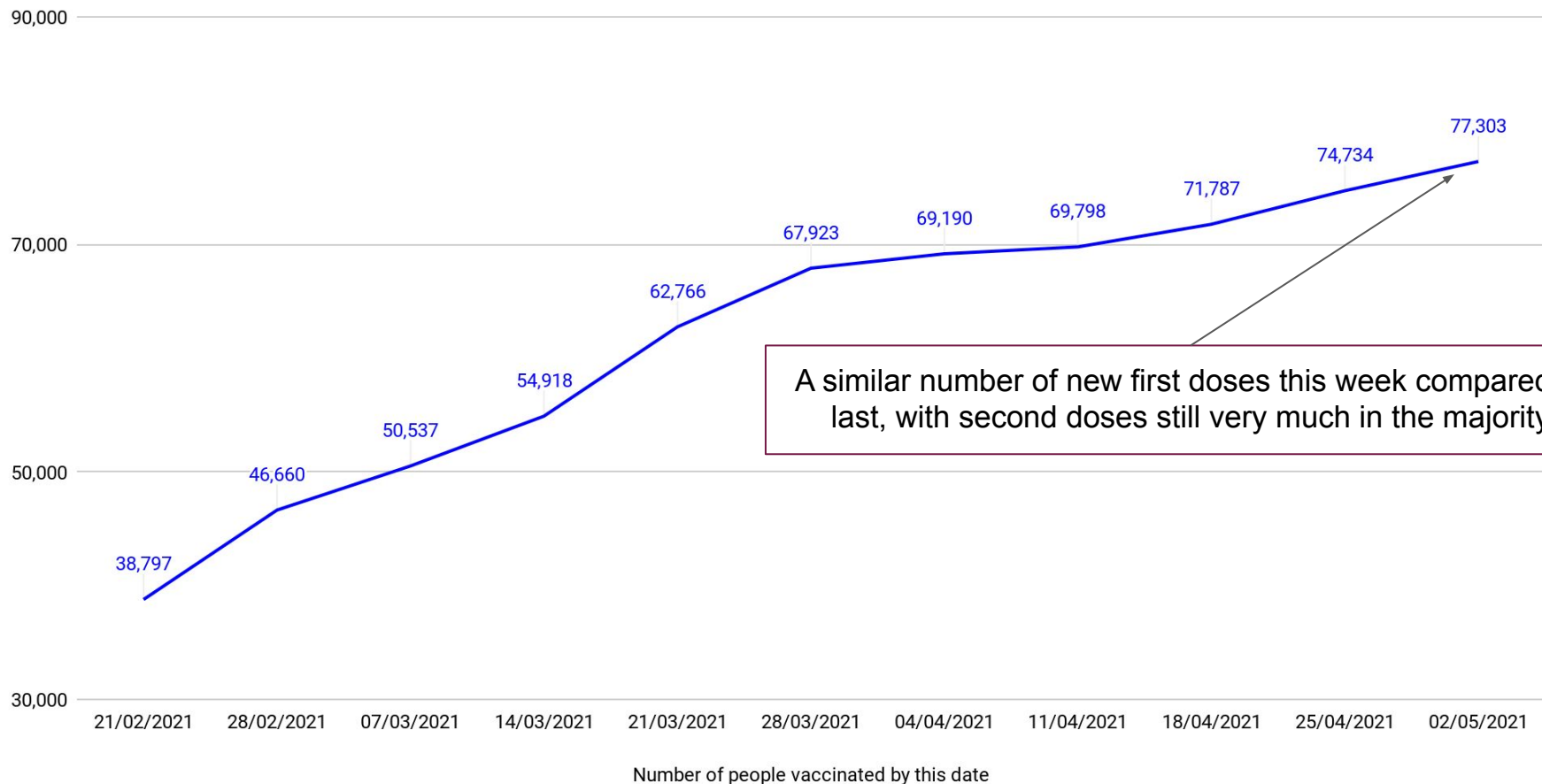


85% (range 80 - 89%) of Kingston residents aged 45 and over had been vaccinated by 2nd May

Over half of the entire borough adult (age 16+) population (range 48 - 55%) had been vaccinated by that date

# Key messages for everyone

- As we continue to reopen, it's really important we do all we can to suppress the spread the virus and keep our rates as low as possible.
- We must **stick to the rules**, follow the **preventative behaviours**, **get tested** regularly and **get vaccinated** when it's our turn.
- **TESTING IS MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER.** If you have **ANY SYMPTOMS** of **COVID-19** - high temperature, new or continuous cough, loss or change in sense of taste or smell - you must **SELF ISOLATE** and **BOOK A TEST** straight away at [nhs.uk/coronavirus](https://nhs.uk/coronavirus) or 119
- You must **continue to self isolate until you get your test results**. If your test is positive, you must isolate for 10 days from the start of your symptoms.





# RAPID TESTING - now for everyone in England

Everyone in England without symptoms can access free, rapid coronavirus tests twice a week to check whether they unknowingly have the virus.



- **1-in-3 people who have coronavirus don't have any symptoms**, but could still be infectious and can pass it on to others without realising.
- Please **keep up with your regular, twice weekly testing** to protect your friends and family.
- **Regular testing is more important than ever** - our rates are low, you can help us find the last few cases in Kingston, and stop onward spread from any new cases.
- **If you test positive** for coronavirus, **we can support you** with food and medicine deliveries, financial support for those eligible, and support with your health and wellbeing. Go to [kingston.gov.uk/Covid19-needhelp](https://kingston.gov.uk/Covid19-needhelp)

# Vaccines - Who's Eligible Right Now?

You no longer need to wait to be contacted if you fall within one of the following groups:

- People aged 40 and over
- People at high risk from coronavirus (clinically extremely vulnerable)
- People at moderate risk from coronavirus (clinically vulnerable)
- People who live or work in care homes
- Those listed on the GP Learning Disability Register

You can book an appointment at a vaccination centre on the NHS website.

- If you are in receipt of, or eligible for Carer's Allowance, you will receive a letter inviting you for vaccination
- Those on the NHS shielded patient list will also receive a letter

# Vaccines - Celebrating milestones

- 50 Million UK doses now given
- 1 in 4 of adult population have now received BOTH doses
- This is an evergreen offer, so if you said “I’ll wait and see”, it’s not too late to book!
- It’s so important that no one gets left behind.



## ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASICS - HANDS - FACE - SPACE & FRESH AIR

- **Keep rooms well ventilated.**

The virus is spread through aerosol particles in the air, so opening windows regularly can cut the amount of virus present in the air in any room.

- **Wear a face covering.**

In shops, hairdressers, barbers, on public transport and in other indoor spaces where social distancing is hard.

- **Even once you've had your coronavirus vaccination**, you must continue to follow all the guidance to control the virus and save lives.
