



Healthcare - national at 08/06/21 (latest data at 14/06/21)




 Rise in patient admissions at national level from May 02-June 08 2021


What is the trend in Kingston for COVID-19?





Kingston Hot Spots, 08/06/21 (data at 14/06/21)







Case rates/100,000/wk by age group, Kingston, 08/06/21, data at 14/06/21)



Additional Kingston local response measures: June 2021

4-point plan to respond to rise in rates: 3 week programme, spanning 9-29 June 2021

- Testing: additional PCR testing in target venues from 9 June 2021
- Tracing
- Self-isolation Support
- Vaccination

• Comms: prevention, supporting plan 9th June 2021->

Key messages for everyone

- Kingston has seen a sharp rise in cases of coronavirus in recent weeks, largely driven by nationwide increase in the Delta variant.
- We are implementing surge testing and are looking to increase opportunities for vaccination to address the situation.
- Everyone in the borough is being asked to get a PCR test, whether or not you have symptoms.
- This is particularly important if you are aged 18 to 24 years, as we are seeing the highest rates in secondary school age children and young adults.
- Walk-in appointments are available at our Market House test site in central Kingston, as well as at Mobile Testing Units across the borough. Find out all the ways to get a free PCR test at <u>www.kingston.gov.uk/surge</u>



Key vaccination messages

 25+ can now book their vaccinations online through the NHS National Booking System

• 50+? Book your second jab now - 8 week interval, not 12.

 40+? Second doses - Hawks Road site is offering walk-in vaccinations this week

ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASICS - HANDS - FACE - SPACE & FRESH AIR

• Keep rooms well ventilated.

The virus is spread through aerosol particles in the air, so opening windows regularly can cut the amount of virus present in the air in any room.

• Wear a face covering.

In shops, hairdressers, barbers, on public transport and in other indoor spaces where social distancing is hard.

Even once you've had your

coronavirus vaccination, you must continue to follow all the guidance to control the virus and save lives.
