




Kingston daily cases at 27/07/21 (latest data at 01/08/21)






What is the trend in Kingston for COVID-19?



Just under 1,000 residents had their first dose in the week to July 25th Three quarters (range 72-82%) of Kingston's adult population have had at least one vaccination

Another busy week for second doses, with 6,000 taking place. Over 60% (range 57-65%) of adult residents are now fully protected.





- ACTION: Encourage young people to get a test



• Are you due? Book your second jab now - 8 week interval, not 12
